Youth Talk "Forgiveness"

Forgiveness... what a jewel! What an amazing thought... to be TOTALLY forgiven. No matter what you have done, no matter how many commandments you've broken, no matter how long you were in sin, God has provided a way for forgiveness.

I have heard from so many lips many times in my life these words: "I forgive them, but I won't EVER forget it!" We try and condone this behavior with saying that we will be on guard so that they won't hurt us in the future, or saying that we can't let people run over us because God wouldn't allow it. With this attitude we are actually saying, "God, I don't believe that You can change anyone..." With this attitude how can we function in our faith?

Folks, we are to be like Jesus. Forgiveness isn't a feeling. It's a choice. Forgiven means: "Stop feeling angry or resentful toward someone for an offense, flaw, or mistake." If we are saying to ourselves that we won't forget their behavior or sin, then we are saying we are holding it against them. This is resentful. One's life...

God doesn't remember our sins. Isaiah 43:25 says, "I, I am He who blots out your sins for My own sake, and will not remember your sins." and again in Psalms 103:12 it says, "As far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us." It is for our 'own sake' that we are to forgive AND to forget the sins committed against us.

Recipe of the Month Best Ever Cookies

Cookie

I cup - Land O Lakes® Butter, softened

I cup - Sugar

I Land O Lakes® All-Natural Egg

2 tablespoons orange juice

I tablespoon vanilla

2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

I teaspoon baking powder

Frosting

3 cups powdered sugar

1/3 cup Land O Lakes® Butter, softened

I teaspoon vanilla

I to 2 tablespoons milk

Food color, if desired



Directions:

Combine I cup softened butter, sugar and egg in large bowl. Beat at medium speed, scraping bowl often, until creamy. Add orange juice and I tablespoon vanilla. Continue beating, scraping bowl often, until well mixed. Add flour and baking powder; beat at low speed until well mixed.

Divide dough into thirds. Shape each third into a ball; flatten slightly. Wrap each in plastic food wrap; refrigerate 2 to 3 hours or until firm.

Heat oven to 400°F. Roll out dough, one-third at a time, on lightly floured surface (keeping remaining dough refrigerated), to 1/8- to 1/4-inch thickness. Cut with 3-inch cookie cutters. Place I inch apart onto ungreased cookie sheets.

Bake 6-10 minutes or until edges are lightly browned. Let stand 1 minute on cookie sheet; remove to cooling rack. Cool completely.

Combine powdered sugar, 1/3 cup butter and I teaspoon vanilla in small bowl. Beat at low speed, scraping bowl often and gradually adding enough milk for desired spreading consistency. Tint with food color, if desired. Frost and decorate cooled cookies as desired.

Variation:

Best Ever Butter Cookies with Glaze: Prepare cookies as directed above omitting frosting. To prepare glaze, stir together 2 1/2 cups powdered sugar, 2 tablespoons water, I tablespoon Land O Lakes® Butter, softened, I tablespoon light corn syrup and 1/2 teaspoon vanilla or almond extract in medium bowl until smooth, adding additional water, if necessary, to reach desired glazing consistency. Tint with food color, if desired. Glaze cooled cookies. Decorate as desired. Let stand 6 hours or overnight until glaze is hardened.





John 4:5-24—New King James Version (NKJV)

- ⁵ So He came to a city of Samaria which is called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. ⁶ Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied from *His* journey, sat thus by the well. It was about the sixth hour.
- ⁷ A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give Me a drink." ⁸ For His disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.
- ⁹ Then the woman of Samaria said to Him, "How is it that You, being a Jew, ask a drink from me, a Samaritan woman?" For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.

Helping a loved one struggling with alcoholism or drug dependence can be heartbreakingly painful, but with help, it can be remarkably rewarding. At times, it can seem so overwhelming that it would be easier to ignore it, pretend that nothing is wrong and hope it just goes away. But in the long run, denying it or minimizing it, will be more damaging to you, other family members, and the person you are concerned about.

Alcoholism and drug dependence are complex problems, with many related issues. And, although there is no magic formula to help someone stop his or her drinking or drug use, you are not alone. The National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence (NCADD) is here to help.

NCADD and its Affiliates offer a range of services including help for individuals and family members. If you are concerned about your own alcohol or other drug use or that of someone you care about—a child or other relative, a friend or co-worker—please make the contact. You will be able to speak to someone who will listen, assess your needs and provide information about available services, costs and how to deal with another person's alcohol and/or drug use.

To get you started, here are some important suggestions:

Learn All You Can About Alcoholism and Drug Dependence

Utilize the resources they offered, such as, pamphlets, books, videos, etc.

Speak Up and Offer Your Support

Talk to the person about your concerns, and offer your help and support, including your willingness to go with them and get help. Like other chronic diseases, the earlier addiction is treated, the better.

Express Love and Concern

Don't wait for your loved one to "hit bottom". You may be met with excuses, denial or anger, but be prepared to respond with specific examples of behavior that has you worried.

Don't Expect the Person to Stop Without Help

You have heard it before - promises to cut down, stop but, it doesn't work. Treatment, support, and new coping skills are needed to overcome addiction to alcohol and drugs.

Support Recovery as an Ongoing Process

Once your friend or family member is receiving treatment, or going to meetings, remain involved. While maintaining your own commitment to getting help, continue to support their participation in continuing care, meetings and recovery support groups. Continue to show that you are concerned about their successful long-term recovery.

Some Things You Don't Want To Do:

- Don't Preach: Don't lecture, threaten, bribe, preach or moralize.
- Don't Be A Martyr: Avoid emotional appeals that may only increase feelings of guilt and the compulsion to drink or use other drugs.
- Don't Cover Up, lie or make excuses for them and their behavior.
- **Don't Assume Their Responsibilities:** Taking over their responsibilities protects them from the consequences of their behavior.
- **Don't Argue When Using:** Arguing with the person when they are using alcohol or drugs, at that point they can't have a rational conversation.
- Don't Feel Guilty or responsible for their behavior, it's not your fault.
- Don't Join Them: Don't try to keep up with them by drinking or using.

The Vineyard of Naboth: Importance of Inheritance

When Ahab reigned as king, he broke his father Omri's record for being the most evil ruler of Israel. Although the Bible says little about Omri, it does state that he built a new national capital city, Samaria, on land for which he paid two talents of silver (I Kings 16:24-25). King David had paid 600 shekels of gold for a much smaller place (I Chron. 21:25). It appears that Omri abused his power to "negotiate" such a tiny price, and this evil example was undoubtedly noted by his son Ahab.

Ahab's request for Naboth's vineyard, which he coveted, seems reasonable on the surface. He offered to either purchase it for money, or to exchange it for a better vineyard (I Kings 21:2). Naboth refused, saying, "The Lord forbid that I should give the inheritance of my fathers to you!" But Ahab reports this response to his wife Jezebel as, "I will not give you my vineyard." (I Kings 21:6) Note that the king has secularized the issue by omitting mention of the Lord. Jezebel hatches a plot to seize the land, by falsely accusing Naboth and having him stoned to death. After this crime was committed, Ahab entered the vineyard to take possession. But the Lord sent Elijah to meet Ahab on the spot, to prophesy judgment against him for his evil, featuring the deaths of Ahab and his entire family (I Kings 21:17-24). Why? Because the violation of the sixth, eighth, ninth, and tenth commandments was against not only Naboth, but also the whole family. Each Israelite family, at the time of Joshua, was given a plot of land as an inheritance from the Lord for sustenance and continuance of that family.

Similar machinations have been coming out of Washington DC for roughly a century. Consider Social Security as one example. While a piece of a worker's net pay may be invested in a retirement vehicle, the FICA "contributions" taken out of paychecks cannot be so used. The government controls the rate at which money is returned to the retiree. More importantly, your FICA funds cannot go to your heirs when you die. There is a spouse benefit for widows, who receive less than they could have under a private alternative, but all other family members are left out in the cold. The government now inherits.

Notice also in I Kings 21:19 that the Lord charges Ahab with murder, even though the actual killing was done by unnamed people following Jezebel's directive. As ruler, Ahab could have canceled the plot. But afterward, Ahab wants to recover the city of Ramoth Gilead from Syria. In fact, Ramoth Gilead was originally one of Israel's cities of refuge (Josh. 21:38). How did Ahab fare in his effort to reclaim an inheritance of the nation? He failed, because he didn't honor Naboth's inheritance, and he was fatally struck in the battle (I Kings 22:34-38), fulfilling part of Elijah's prophecy.

There is more to the story. Years later Jehu, commander of the army, is anointed king of Israel while camped at Ramoth Gilead, and given a divine assignment to destroy Ahab's family. The conflict began (where else?) on Naboth's property, and that is where the body of King Joram, Ahab's heir to the throne, was dumped (2 Kings 9:21-26). Jehu went on to complete the assignment, pointedly including Jezebel, and he was thorough in execution. As Jehu said in 2 Kings 10:10, "Know now that nothing shall fall to the earth of the Word of the Lord which the Lord spoke concerning the house of Ahab; for the Lord has done what He spoke by His servant Elijah."

After His resurrection, news started to spread, but some still did not know that He was alive again. Two of these people were Cleopas and his friend. Jesus was walking right alongside of them as they were walking toward Emmaus, and they didn't even realize it! Jesus was able to show them in the Scriptures how the prior events were predicted by the prophet Isaiah, King David and Moses.

Secondly, we will discuss how Jesus sent us a Counselor, Helper, to guide us in our Christian life. Amazingly, this truth "sets Christianity apart from all other religions." We have a "living, moment-by-moment connection with a living, active Person-the Holy Spirit". How awesome!

Thirdly, we will learn the story of Jesus talking to the Samaritan woman at the well. Jesus told her that if she drinks from the "living water", she would never thirst again. The water He was referring to offers eternal life. After she realized that He was the Savior, she ran and told the other Samaritans, who were eager to hear Jesus speak to them about God. This story brings us the truth that eternal life is not just for the Jews, but for all who will receive Him.

Finally, we will be starting a new unit where we will be learning about the value of forgiveness. We will be studying this important value into the month of May, so please have your kids in Sunday school each week. They won't want to miss it! Please know the importance of equipping these children for life. They are our future generation.

This month begins with Lesson 6: The Lord Appears. The scripture for this lesson will come from Luke 24:36-53. The focus of Lesson 6 is: "We tell others how God keeps His promises." 




