Psalm 22:3


³ But Thou art holy, O Thou that inhabitest the praises of Israel.

Save money on gas - Walk with God.

Recipe of the Month Homemade Laundry Soap (DO NOT EAT)

Ingredients:

5 Gallon Bucket with a lid (Home Depot has them) Box of Borax Powder Box of Arm & Hammer Washing Soda

A cheap grater—(Dollar Tree has them)

2 Bars of Ivory Soap—(You can use other soaps, but not deodorant soap or moisturizing bars.)

Directions:

Grate 2 bars of soap. Dissolve it in about 4 cups of hot water on the stovetop over med-low heat.

Step 4: Add soap mixture to your 5 gallon bucket and fill bucket half way with hot water. Stir in 2 cups Arm and Hammer Washing Soda and I cup Borax. Dissolve completely.

Step 5: Fill bucket the rest of the way with hot water. Recipe complete. - You can use old detergent bottles to make it easier doing laundry. I use 2-4 oz per load of laundry. This stuff is great. Gentle on sensitive skin, brightens colors, takes care of stains, whitens white clothes, and is earth friendly. You can make about 15 gallons for less than \$10.

The Crucified Life of the Holy Spirit

(We want to encourage you to look up the Scripture references as you read.)

If we often forget to consider the viewpoint of the Father or of Jesus, we will even more often forget to consider the Holy Spirit. Part of the reason for this is that the words of the Holy Spirit are recorded in the Bible relatively few times. Clearly, the Spirit's words are recorded in Revelation 14:13b. In other places, He may speak but be identified in another way. Wisdom is talking in Proverbs 1:20-33, but I believe that these are actually the Holy Spirit's words.

Natural thinking would figure that an all-powerful God will speak in a window shattering voice. Of course He certainly can (Psalm 29:5), but usually He employs the still small voice, which is more useful in testing the hearts of men. Unfortunately this means that very many people will ignore Him, reject Him, or doubt His existence. The Holy Spirit, too, is living the crucified life.

Even among those who have been cleansed by the Blood of Jesus, the Spirit does not necessarily have an easy time. Many Christians forget His personhood and refer to Him as an "it." Or, they say they belong to Jesus, but will not receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit, even though He resides in a measure within every believer. John I:II states, "He came unto His own, and His own received Him not." This verse primarily means that Jesus came down to Israel, and the Jews rejected Him. But the verse can also mean that the Holy Spirit came into the Church, and Christians rejected Him.

Bible believing Christians generally do acknowledge the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5), and the Charismatics will acknowledge the validity of the gifts of the Spirit (I Corinthians I2) for today. However, it's easy for some of us to focus on the gifts and not the Source of these gifts. Many parents know what it is like, when on Christmas day your kids are enjoying the presents you gave them, while they ignore you. Moreover, the fruit of the Spirit can be imitated on the natural level. Very often when genuine fruit is manifest, we give credit to man and not the Holy Spirit. Again, the Holy Spirit is living the crucified life.


In John 14:16, Jesus said, "And I will pray the Father, and He shall give you another Comforter, that He may abide with you forever..." Jesus spent 33 years on earth being faced with the attitudes of men. The Holy Spirit so far has spent 2000 years putting up with the attitudes of men. In addition, the Holy Spirit is the most sensitive member of the Godhead. In accordance with this, the blasphemy of the Holy Spirit carries the more serious penalty (Matthew 12:31-32).

We are informed in I Corinthians 3:16 that we are the temple of the Holy Spirit. To select a mild example, the Spirit probably does not appreciate residing within a tobacco-smoking saint. Surely, readers can identify other scenarios. More importantly, our temples are defiled by sins that come out of the heart (Matthew I5:18-19), of which there is a long list!

Still another class of sins that grieve the Holy Spirit relates to sectarianism, divisions, etc. But let's take the approach that we choose not to make the Holy Spirit live the crucified life. Instead, do what pleases Him. We can honor Him by worshipping Jesus. We can spend time praying in the Holy Ghost. We can pursue the fruit of the Spirit in our lives!

Resist him (satan) in the Name of Jesus!



Resist him like someone resisting arrest. When you act that way toward the devil, he will flee from you—James 4:7 guarantees it!

The word 'flee' in that Scripture doesn't just mean he leaves the scene. It literally means, "he runs as in terror." The reason he runs is because you bear the name of Jesus. That Name strikes terror into every fiber of the devil's twisted being.

God also hath highly exalted Him (Jesus) and given Him a Name which is above every name. That at the Name of Jesus, every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth. That includes the devil! He has to bow his knee at the Name of Jesus. Now you can see why, when you resist the devil in Jesus' Name, he flees from you. He has no choice!

Jesus is the One who defeated him. After Jesus spoiled principalities and powers (Colossians 2:15), He (Jesus) made an open show of them publicly, triumphing over them. Satan was humiliated in front of all the angels of heaven and the demons of hell. He (satan) is defeated and he knows it. Jesus is the one who defeated him and it is His (Jesus') Name you're wearing!

So the next time satan tries to put something over on you, resist him in the Name of Jesus. Say, "Satan, I take authority over you. I resist you in the name of Jesus and I will not receive (whatever he's trying to tell you or give you). According to Colossians 2:15, you are defeated! I am victorious! AMEN!"

Directions to our Father's House


Make a Right onto "Believeth Boulevard."






Kids' Corner "Jesus Rose Again!"

Luke 24:1-12 (Amplified)

- ¹ But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, [the women] went to the tomb, taking the spices which they had made ready.
- ² And they found the stone rolled back from the tomb,
- ³ But when they went inside, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus.
- ⁴ And while they were perplexed and wondering what to do about this, behold, two men in dazzling raiment suddenly stood beside them.
- ⁵ And as [the women] were frightened and were bowing their faces to the ground, the men said to them, Why do you look for the living among [those who are] dead?
- ⁶ He is not here, but has risen! Remember how He told you while He was still in Galilee
- ⁷ That the Son of Man must be given over into the hands of sinful men (men whose way or nature is to act in opposition to God) and be crucified and on the third day rise [from death].
- ⁸ And they remembered His words.

Health Check



As a family disease, those who have been affected by addiction may take years to recover, as they rebuild and stabilize their lives, independent of what the alcohol and drug addicted family member does. Without question, it can seem overwhelming, but it helps to keep in mind that commitment to the recovery process is also a commitment to the overall well-being of the whole family.

Constructive and active family engagement in the recovery process is essential if the family is to heal from the destructive impact of addiction. To move on in hope, families need a variety of supports, information and skills including the following:

- I. End the Isolation and Connect: By joining an education or support group.
- **2.** Education on Addiction and the Family: Understanding how addiction affects both the addicted person and the family is an essential foundation to moving on.
- **3.** <u>Learn Communication Skills</u>: Active addiction destroys family communication. Developing these skills is essential to family recovery.
 - **4. Detachment and Responsibility for Self:** Learning to detach with love and focus on assuming responsibility for our own behavior.
- **5. Stop Old Behaviors:** Many of our old ways of coping are ineffective and contribute to the problem not the solution: enabling, denial, blaming and minimizing the problem.
- **6.** Engage the Children: As a parent, depending on ages, you play a critically important role in providing support and protection for the children. But, engaging them in their own recovery is very important.
- 7. <u>Build on Resilience</u>: Surviving active addiction to alcohol and drugs is never easy. Use the recovery process as a means of building on your personal and family strengths.
- 8. <u>Engage in Personal and Family Activities</u>: working alone and together to find activities that serve as a source of personal and family fulfillment (ex. volunteering)
- **9.** <u>Understand and Prepare for Relapse</u>: Relapse into old behaviors is as real for family members as it is for those addicted to alcohol and drugs. Family members need to develop strategies for dealing with their own relapse issues and other challenges.

People recovering from alcoholism and drug addiction, their families, and their children can and often do achieve optimum levels of health and functioning, but this achievement is best measured in years rather than days, weeks, or months. In the process of recovery, families are strengthened through increased levels of genuine intimacy and families are better able to cope with life's challenges. Over time, the discipline of recovery can bring the family together to be the healthiest it has ever been!

Joseph Prince "If You Can Believe"



...Jesus looked at them and said to them, "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

Matthew 19:26

When a poor demon-possessed child was brought to Jesus, the father of the child, obviously desperate, said to Jesus, "...if You can do anything, have compassion on us and help us." Jesus replied, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes" (Mark 9:22–23).

Now, many of us have been taught that Jesus was saying that as long as you have the necessary faith, all things are possible for you. In other words, if you can produce the faith, you can have your miracle. But is this what Jesus meant?

If you study the Greek structure of this verse, what Jesus was actually saying was that all things are possible for *Him* who always believes. Jesus is the only Man who always believes, who always has perfect faith. And because He is Lord, all things are possible for Him!

My friend, simply hook your limited faith to the perfect faith of the Son of God. Just believe that He Himself has all the faith for your miracle. Even when you are faithless, believe that He remains faithful (2 Timothy 2:13). When you rest in His faith that NEVER fails, you'll see His faithfulness bring your miracle to pass!

The Legend of the Dogwood

It is legend that the dogwood was once the size of the oak and other forest trees. It was so strong and firm that it was chosen as the timber for Christ's cross. This greatly distressed the tree. Grief

Joseph Parker (1830-1902) was a beloved English preacher. When his wife died, he didn't have the customary wording inscribed on her gravestone. Instead of the word *died* followed by the date of her death, he chose the word *ascended*.

Parker found great comfort in being reminded that though his wife's body had been placed in the grave, the "real" Mrs. Parker had been transported to heaven and into the presence of her Savior. When Parker himself died, his friends made sure that his gravestone read:

ASCENDED NOVEMBER 28, 1902

When a believing loved one dies, or when we ourselves face the process of dying, there's great comfort in the fact that "to be absent from the body" is "to be present with the Lord." (2 Corinthians 5:8)

Death for us is not a dark journey into the unknown. It is not a lonely walk into a strange and friendless place. Rather, it is a glorious transition from the trials of earth into the joys of heaven, where we will be reunited with our loved ones in Christ who have gone before. Best of all, we will enjoy the presence of our Lord forever.

Grief

The Bible is a comfort for those that are hurting. If you are grieving for the loss of a loved one or experiencing any other grief, you are in need of encouragement and comfort.

For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so God will bring with Him those who have fallen asleep in Jesus. For this we say to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, and remain until the coming of the Lord, shall not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trumpet of God; and the dead in Christ shall rise first. Then we who are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and thus we shall always be with the Lord. Therefore comfort one another with these words.

Children's Sunday School Ages 6-11


For the month of April, we will be talking about one of my favorite subjects, Christ's blood!!! How appropriate to learn about His sacred amazing blood during the celebration of His death and resurrection. Leviticus 17:11 states, "For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you upon the altar to make atonement for your souls; for it is the blood that makes atonement for the soul". This Old Testament fact tells about the universal importance of the blood, but the story doesn't end here.

First of all, we will be going through the scientific biological properties of how the blood works. It is important for the kids to see this, because it will become obvious how our sins are "washed" by His blood. Did you know our heart forces blood through our whole body in less than a minute? Our blood purifies or "cleanses" our body! Can you see the correlation yet? In the same way our blood cleanses our earthly bodies, Christ's holy and sinless blood brings eternal life to our spirits, carries (cancels) out death and washes our sins away. It is continually cleansing and purifying us. I John 1:9 says that when we confess our sins to Him, our sins are forgiven, and we are "cleansed" from all unrighteousness. What sin do we have?

Isaiah 53:1-9 details what Christ's blood did for us. We will be spending some time in this passage, so they are able to see what He brought forth to us when He shed His blood. If His blood is powerful enough to wash sins away and save our souls, how can we not believe (understand) that it is powerful enough to erase pain, sickness, rejection, addiction, poverty, loneliness, depression, or any ailment that may try to attach itself to us. The shedding of Christ's blood was enough for all mankind for all eternity! Hallelujah!!

Finally, we will be doing more speed drills and skits this month to help solidify this teaching. We will also spend some time on the resurrection which signified that He overcame death, so we can now have liberty and eternal life with Him. Christ's blood carries in life, and carries out death! He is alive and so are we!


