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Youth Talk Leadership

What is a 'leader?' Whether a good OR bad leader, a leader is someone who leads. Wow, imagine that. We all can be considered a leader if someone is **following** us or if we influence another individual. If you are a parent, a supervisor, in church leadership, a saved individual, the first one in line at the grocery store, or first in a line of traffic, etc., you are a leader. As a godly leader, I believe that it is imperative to be a good example to follow. One that doesn't lead others in the wrong direction.

It is believed that Jesus' disciples were all teenagers when they were called to follow Christ. "I never heard that!" you might say. However, if you seek out the scriptures, it is very clear. Based on Jewish traditions, these young men were looking for a Rabbi in which to train under to further their education after their Torah obligations. If a Rabbi or formal teacher would not accept them, they were to learn their father's trade in order to provide for their future family. That's why some (Matthew 4:18-22) were fishing and left their boat and father in a hurry. They so longed for a Rabbi to teach them. They were looking for His appearing. That's why they did not hesitate to leave everything behind to follow after Jesus who had the appearance of a Rabbi.

Another sign was that not all of them were required to pay taxes, only Jesus and Simon Peter (Matthew 17:24-27). This shows that they were all under the age of twenty except Jesus and Peter because in Exodus 30:14-15, Jewish law states that every male over the age of 20 is to pay a half-shekel as census offering when they visit the temple of God.

It seems that they were all unmarried except for Peter. There was no mention of any of them being married with one exception; Jesus healed Peter's mother-in-law in Matthew 8:14-15. Jewish tradition is that you marry at age eighteen. Also, in Matthew 11:25, Luke 10:21, and John 13:33, Jesus calls his disciples little children; a bit insulting if they were adults.

With all this in mind, Jesus is the best example of a Youth Leader than we can even imagine. He said to let the little children come to him. Do not hinder them. Let them come to him, nose rings, tattoos, blue hair and all. Just let them! Don't stop them or try to change their appearance. They are more tender towards God than you can imagine.

The youth today are not only looking for older folks to guide them, but they are looking for leaders their age who will stand up and do the right thing. "Teen Leaders" that will not be sucked into doing it the "world's way." We have three "Teen Leaders" in our Youth Group that we hold to a much higher standard than most. They are not perfect, as none of us are, but they truly have become great examples of Christ-like behavior. They read their Bibles, pray, and are not afraid to stand up for what's right at home and at school. We are proud to have that many among our 23-28 youth and will be adding more to that accountability group as we are watching some quickly maturing in the Lord. As a "Teen Leader," these youth have the privilege to travel and attend special preparatory classes to aid them in their roles. They are also chosen to lead in many different ways during class as well as for special events.

Our Youth are looking to be taught the right way to live. They are seeking out whom they will serve and learn as the disciples did in Jesus' time. Be there for them, no matter what their age. They are special and God has a special plan for their lives. I plan on doing all I can to make sure that I am a part of these incredible lives that God has chosen me to be a part of for "such a time as this..."

Recipe of the Month

Crockpot Your Heart Will Love Ya! Chicken

- l each red, green, and yellow pepper, cut into strips
- I onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- I 8-oz. can sliced water chestnuts, drained
- 14-1/2 oz. jar whole mushrooms, drained
- 1/2 tsp ground ginger
- 4-6 boneless chicken breasts
- 4 Tbls hoisin sauce
- I tsp cayenne pepper

Hoisin Sauce

- (a sauce or glaze used in Chinese cooking)
- 4 tablespoons soy sauce
- 2 tablespoons peanut butter or black bean paste
- I tablespoon honey or molasses or brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons white vinegar
- 1/8 teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 teaspoons sesame oil
- 20 drops Chinese hot sauce, habanera or jalapeño
- 1/8 teaspoon black pepper

Place chicken breasts in slow cooker with the water, garlic, and ginger. Drizzle hoisin sauce over top of chicken and sprinkle with cayenne pepper. Cook on Low for 8 hours or High for 4 hours. Place the peppers, onion, water chestnuts, and mushrooms in the slow cooker 30 minutes before serving. Stir to blend.



I will not fear. Refusing to fear is first of all a matter of the will. As Psalm 118:6 indicates it is also a matter of choosing to believe that in every situation God is on your side and by His power, He will see you through. To successfully walk by faith and not fear, we need to know exactly how to tap into the power II Peter 1:3-4 tells us His (God's) "...divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him that hath called us to glory and virtue. We are given exceeding great and precious promises that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust."

God makes available everything we could possibly need, every conceivable blessing, through the promises in His word. If we'll believe them and activate the law of the Spirit of Life, those promises will manifest in our lives. The will open the way for us to escape the destruction brought in to the earth by the law of sin and death. Satan challenges those promises with fear. Restoration of the Temple Begins

Ezra 3:1-13

And when the seventh month had come, and the children of Israel were in the cities, the people gathered together as one man to Jerusalem. ² Then Jeshua the son of Jozadak and his brethren the priests, and Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel and his brethren, arose and built the altar of the God of Israel, to offer burnt offerings on it, as it is written in the Law of Moses the man of God.

³ Though fear *had come* upon them because of the people of those countries, they set the altar on its bases; and they offered burnt offerings on it to the LORD, *both* the morning and evening burnt offerings.

⁴ They also kept the Feast of Tabernacles, as *it is* written, and *offered* the daily burnt offerings in the number required by ordinance for each day. ⁵ Afterwards they offered the regular burnt offering, and those for New Moons and for all the appointed feasts of the LORD that were consecrated, and those of everyone who willingly offered a freewill offering to the LORD.

⁶ From the first day of the seventh month they began to offer burnt offerings to the LORD, although the foundation of the temple of the LORD had not been laid. ⁷ They also gave money to the masons and the carpenters, and food, drink, and oil to the people of Sidon and Tyre to bring cedar logs from Lebanon to the sea, to Joppa, according to the permission which they had from Cyrus king of Persia.

⁸ Now in the second month of the second year of their coming to the house of God at Jerusalem, Zerubbabel the son of Shealtiel, Jeshua the son of Jozadak, and the rest of their brethren the priests and the Levites, and all those who had come out of the captivity to Jerusalem, began work and appointed the Levites from twenty years old and above to oversee the work of the house of the LORD. ⁹ Then Jeshua with his sons and brothers, Kadmiel with his sons, and the sons of Judah, arose as one to oversee those working on the house of God: the sons of Henadad with their sons and their brethren the Levites.

When the builders laid the foundation of the temple of the LORD, the priests stood in their apparel with trumpets, and the Levites, the sons of Asaph, with cymbals, to praise the LORD, according to the ordinance of David king of Israel. ¹¹ And they sang responsively, praising and giving thanks to the LORD:

"For He is good,

For His mercy endures forever toward Israel."

Then all the people shouted with a great shout, when they praised the LORD, because the foundation of the house of the LORD was laid.


¹² But many of the priests and Levites and heads of the fathers' houses, old men who had seen the first temple, wept with a loud voice when the foundation of this temple was laid before their eyes. Yet many shouted aloud for joy, ¹³ so that the people could not discern the noise of the shout of joy from the noise of the weeping of the people, for the people shouted with a loud shout, and the sound was heard afar off.

Does God Exist?

A man went to a barbershop to have his hair cut and his beard trimmed. As the barber began to work, they began to have a good conversation. They talked about so many things and various subjects.

When they eventually touched on the subject of God, the barber said: 'I don't believe that God exists.'

'Why do you say that?' asked the customer.

'Well, you just have to go out in the street to realize that God doesn't exist. Tell me, if God exists, would there be so many sick people? Would there be abandoned children? If God existed, there would be neither suffering nor pain. I can't imagine a loving God who would allow all of these things,' replied the barber.

The customer thought for a moment, but didn't respond because he didn't want to start an argument. The barber finished his job and the customer left the shop.

Just after he left the barbershop, he saw a man in the street with long, stringy, dirty hair and an untrimmed beard. He looked dirty and unkempt. The customer turned back and entered the barbershop again and he said to the barber: 'You know what? Barbers do not exist.'

'How can you say that?' asked the surprised barber. 'I am here, and I am a barber. And I just worked on you!'

'No!' the customer exclaimed. 'Barbers don't exist because if they did, there would be no people with dirty long hair and untrimmed beards, like that man outside.'

'Ah, but barbers DO exist! That's what happens when people do not come to me,' replied the barber.

'Exactly!' affirmed the customer. 'That's the point! God, too, DOES exist! That's what happens when people do not go to Him and don't look to Him for help. That's why there's so much pain and suffering in the world...'

Psalm 19:

- The heavens keep telling the wonders of God, and the skies declare what he has done.
- 2 Each day informs the following day; each night announces to the next.
- 3 They don't speak a word, and there is never the sound of a voice.
- 4 Yet their message reaches all the earth, and it travels around the world.

Courage and Cowardice

The Star Spangled Banner, our national anthem, contains the phrase, "the land of the free, and the home of the brave." Many Americans still imagine that we have the same amount of freedom as earlier, even in the face of increasing regulations in the areas of taxation, airline travel, and medical care. Or, we may recall awesome stories of American military bravery during World War II. But how well have we continued in the footsteps of these heroes?

In 1978, the newly received refugee from the Soviet Union, Alexander Solzhenitsyn, was invited to deliver a graduation speech at Harvard University. One of the things he stated was, "A decline in courage may be the most striking feature which an outside observer notices in the West in our days." He was considered a hero in the U.S. until giving this address, after which he was rejected by the influential elite of our nation. My perception is, we are exhibiting much less courage in America than in 1978.

On Sept. 11, 2001, our news media were blasting the "cowardly attack" by radical Muslims on America. Personally, I feel that the participating terrorists were more courageous than the Muslims who had no role in the attacks. The most salient feature of the attacks was that they were extremely evil. But our media were amazingly reluctant to call them evil. So, who were the real cowards?

Jonathan and his armor bearer, just two men, went up against the Philistine garrison in I Samuel chapter 14. That was an act of courage, because they acted alone and would not have been backed up by the army of Israel had things turned bad. But they weren't really alone: The Lord was present, according to their faith.

Jeremiah was instructed by the Lord to prophesy a hard message to Judah, knowing in advance that the message would be rejected. Most of the time, he stood alone against the nation: a good example of courage. Other examples include Daniel and his three companions.

Not all of the Israelites were courageous. Gideon sent the majority of his troops home on account of their fear. When Moses sent the twelve spies into Canaan, they all observed the bounty of the land. Nevertheless, ten of them proved to be cowards, and only two courageous. Even so, Joshua was charged to be "very courageous" in Joshua 1:7, not merely courageous. The context is meditating in the Word; there is a definite connection linking courage and faith.

Jesus is the best example of courage. He knew that his time on the earth would lead to crucifixion. But can you imagine Him saying to His disciples, "I have a dynamite teaching for you, to appear in John 14, 15, and 16, but I am so freaked out by fear over the Cross that I'm unable to give it." Not only did the teaching go forth, but Jesus passed up several opportunities to escape the Cross.

I believe that the decline in courage in America is related to the watering down of Christianity in large segments of the church. Here is an opportunity to seek the Kingdom and shine as lights, as described in:

Philippians I:28 (Amp.)—And do not [for a moment] be frightened or intimidated in anything by your opponents and adversaries, for such [constancy and fearlessness] will be a clear sign (proof and seal) to them of [their impending] destruction, but [a sure token and evidence] of your deliverance and salvation, and that from God.

and

Philippians 2:15 (Amp.)—That you may show yourselves to be blameless and guileless, innocent and uncontaminated, children of God without blemish (faultless, unrebukable) in the midst of a crooked and wicked generation [spiritually perverted and perverse], among whom you are seen as bright lights (stars or beacons shining out clearly) in the [dark] world,

Also, he proclaimed how there are many different talents and roles to be filled in the church. As Pastor Bob always says, we all have different gifts, and we need to utilize them to all be in unity with each other. Paul notes that we have leaders, such as our pastor, whom we must obey and submit.


