



Youth Talk "Back to School"



It's that time again! Time to shop for the school supplies, purchase uniforms, review schedules... not to mention the early mornings. Back to school time affects everyone! You don't even have to have children to be affected! Your commute changes due to the number of parents and buses on the road, you deal with longer lines at most retail stores, etc. It seems that our nation revolves around our kids; school beginning and ending, Christmas time, holiday breaks, summer breaks, vacations, sales schedules at retail stores, etc.

What are we as parents doing during this time? Are we anxiously getting prepared and ready to 'send them away' for the day so that we can, 'get something done?' Is that why they are in school? Have you caught yourself saying those words? Do you even flinch as they leave your lips?

Amazingly enough, we as adults tend to 'go with the flow' of what our nation revolves around. We even talk like the world when it comes to this season. Unfortunately, we are not encouraging our children any more than the non-believer is. Think about that...

So what should our 'take' be on this? Proverbs 22:6 says in the Amplified, "Train up a child in the way he should go [and in **keeping with his individual gift or bent**], and when he is old he will not depart from it." Are we training our children in their God-given gifts that we see in their lives?

John 15:16-19 (Amplified) "16 You have not chosen Me, but I have chosen you and I have appointed you [I have planted you], that you might go and bear fruit and keep on bearing, and that your fruit may be lasting [that it may remain, abide], so that whatever you ask the Father in My Name [as presenting all that I AM], He may give it to you. ¹⁷ This is what I command you: that you love one another. ¹⁸ If the world hates you, know that it hated Me before it hated you. ¹⁹ If you belonged to the world, the world would treat you with affection and would love you as its own. But because you are not of the world [no longer one with it], but I have chosen (selected) you out of the world, the world hates (detests) you."

This world does not like you. It detests you, loathes you, despises you. It doesn't like that you serve Christ. Furthermore, it hates and detests your children. With this in mind, we have to think a lot more carefully about our words when discussing our children. SAY WHAT YOU WANT!

Recipe of the Month Healthy Banana Oatmeal Sponge Cookies

(Makes 12-18 Cookies)

Ingredients:

I cup mashed ripe banana

½ teaspoon vanilla

1/3 cup raisins

2 cups oatmeal

1/4 cup applesauce

½ teaspoon cinnamon

Directions

- 1. Heat oven to 350 degrees.
- Mix all ingredients until moist. (I use old-fashioned rolled oats, but imagine you could use quick-cook oats instead). Mixture will be gooey and sticky. That is normal.
- 3. Drop by tablespoonful onto ungreased baking sheet.
- 4. Flatten to desired thickness and shape, as cookies WILL NOT spread on baking.
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes.
- 6. Remove to wire rack to cool.



Let The Weak Say, 'I Am Strong!'



"Beat your plowshares into swords, and your pruning hooks into spears; let the weak say, I am strong [a warrior]!"

- Joel 3:10 Amplified Bible (AMP)

Your confession is what you say—not just with your lips, but with your actions. Jesus is the High Priest of your confession. That means He has the authority to bring to pass anything you confess by faith that is in line with His word. That means when you're

broke and you confess by faith, "My God supplies ALL my needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:19). Jesus has the authority to deliver to you the necessary finances, or when you are sick and you confess by Faith, "I am healed by the stripes of Jesus," you put yourself in a position to receive that healing from Him.

When the prophet Joel said, "Let the weak say, 'I am strong.' "He wasn't telling people to lie. He was delivering a spiritual principle. He was telling God's people that they should say what God says about them, instead of what their circumstances say about them. When you confess the word instead of your circumstances you are laying down your own viewpoint and speaking from God's viewpoint instead.

Psalm 127:1-5 (Amplified) - A Song of Ascents.

Of Solomon.— "Except the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it; except the Lord keeps the city, the watchman wakes but in vain. ² It is vain for you to rise up early, to take rest late, to eat the bread of [anxious] toil—for He gives [blessings] to His beloved in sleep. ³ Behold, **children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward.** ⁴ As arrows are in the hand of a warrior, so are the children of one's youth. ⁵ Happy, blessed, and fortunate is the man whose quiver is filled with them! They will not be put to shame when they speak with their adversaries [in gatherings] at the [city's] gate."

Are we as Christians happy that we have children? Are we constantly complaining about them? Are we encouraging them as they go out into a world that despises and hates them?

Heavenly Father, show my children how to bless the students, faculty, & community in which You have placed them.

2 Corinthians 2:14-15

James 3:8-12—(Amplified) -"But the human tongue can be tamed by no man. It is a restless (undisciplined, irreconcilable) evil, full of deadly poison. With it we bless the Lord and Father, and with it we curse men who were made in God's likeness! ¹⁰ Out of the same mouth come forth blessing and cursing. These things, my brethren, ought not to be so. ¹¹ Does a fountain send forth [simultaneously] from the same opening fresh water and bitter? ¹² Can a fig tree, my brethren, bear olives, or a grapevine figs? Neither can a salt spring furnish fresh water."

With these scriptures in mind, how can one be excited to 'get rid of their children' for the day? Is it because we as a nation have allowed ourselves to be like the world when it comes to our kids? Are we constantly 'doing something' to the point that we can't even simply sit down to a game of checkers, or go outside and teach our children while they play?

We send our children to school and hope for the best, but do we pray for AND with them daily? Do we take time to talk to them about their day? Their friends? Or just simple talk to them? This generation can see through the half-hearted parental units that simply have children as a tax write-off, or birthed them into this world because it seemed like the thing to do.





Streams of Life-Giving Water

³⁷ On the last and most important day of the festival, Jesus stood up and shouted, "If you are thirsty, come to me and drink! ³⁸ Have faith in me, and you will have life-giving water flowing from deep inside you, just as the Scriptures say." ³⁹ Jesus was talking about the Holy Spirit, who would be given to everyone that had faith in him. The Spirit had not yet been given to anyone, since Jesus had not yet been given his full glory.

The People Take Sides

⁴⁰ When the crowd heard Jesus say this, some of them said, "He must be the Prophet!" ⁴¹ Others said, "He is the Messiah!" Others even said, "Can the Messiah come from Galilee? ⁴² The Scriptures say that the Messiah will come from the family of King David. Doesn't this mean that he will be born in David's hometown of Bethlehem?" ⁴³ The people started taking sides against each other because of Jesus. ⁴⁴ Some of them wanted to arrest Him, but no one laid a hand on Him.

Jesus Is the Light for the World

¹²Once again Jesus spoke to the people. This time he said, "I am the light for the world! Follow me, and you won't be walking in the dark. You will have the light that gives life." ¹³ The Pharisees objected, "You are the only one speaking for yourself, and what you say isn't true!"

¹⁴ Jesus replied:


"Even if I do speak for myself, what I say is true! I know where I came from and where I am going. But you don't know where I am from or where I am going. ¹⁵ You judge in the same way that everyone else does, but I don't judge anyone. ¹⁶ If I did judge, I would judge fairly, because I would not be doing it alone. The Father who sent me is here with me. ¹⁷ Your Law requires two witnesses to prove that something is true. ¹⁸ I am one of my witnesses, and the Father who sent me is the other one."

¹⁹ "Where is your Father?" they asked. "You don't know me or my Father!" Jesus answered. "If you knew me, you would know my Father." ²⁰ Jesus said this while He was still teaching in the place where the temple treasures were stored. But no one arrested him, because His time had not yet come.

HEALTHY HABITS MEAN HEALTHY EYES.

When cared for properly, contact lenses can provide a comfortable and convenient way to work, play, and live for the 30 million plus people in the U.S. who wear them. While contact lenses are usually a safe and effective form of vision correction, they are not entirely risk-free—especially if they are not cared for properly. Contact lenses are medical devices, and failure to wear, clean, and store them as directed can increase the risk of eye infections. To reap the benefits of wearing contact lenses, it is essential to practice healthy habits. **Remember: Healthy Habits = Healthy Eyes.** Your habits, supplies, and eye doctor are all essential to keeping your eyes healthy. Follow these tips:

Your Habits



Wash your hands with soap and water. Dry them well with a clean cloth before touching your contact lenses every time.



Don't sleep in your contact lenses unless prescribed by your eye doctor.



Keep water away from your contact lenses. Avoid showering in contact lenses, and remove them before using a hot tub or swimming.

Your Supplies



Your Contact Lenses

Rub and rinse your contact lenses with contact lens disinfecting solution—never water or saliva—to clean them each time you remove them.

Never store your contact lenses in water.

Replace your contact lenses as often as recommended by your eye doctor.

Your Contact Lens Case

Rub and rinse your contact lens case with contact lens solution—never water—and then empty and dry with a clean tissue. Store upside down with the caps off after each use.

Replace your contact lens case at least once every three months.



Your Contact Lens Solution

Don't "top off" solution. Use only fresh contact lens disinfecting solution in your case—never mix fresh solution with old or used solution.

Use only the contact lens solution recommended by your eye doctor.

Your Eye Doctor



Visit your eye doctor yearly or as often as he or she recommends.



Ask your eye doctor if you have questions about how to care for your contact lenses and case or if you are having any difficulties.



Remove your contact lenses immediately and call your eye doctor if you have eye pain, discomfort, redness, or blurred vision.

Be Prepared



Carry a backup pair of glasses with a current prescription—just in case you have to take out your contact.



Children's Sunday School


Ages 6-11

For the month of August, the children's Sunday School class will be studying John chapters 7 and 8. We had so much fun last month doing our fish craft and reviewing the miracle where Jesus fed the five thousand. We are furthering our study in John with words straight from the mouth of Jesus. Incredibly, in chapter 7 and 8 we see that even after all of the miracles Jesus did, the Jews and Pharisees were still unable to see and believe that Jesus was the Son of God. John 8:18 says, "I am one that bear witness of myself, and the Father that sent me beareth witness of me". Jesus spends some time in these Scriptures explaining to the people that since they have seen Him and the miracles that He has done, they have also seen the works of His Father who hath sent Him.

We will spend some time reviewing verses 37-39, "Jesus stood and cried, saying, 'If any man thirst, let him come unto Me, and drink. He that believeth on Me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water. But this spake He of the Spirit, which they that believe on Him should receive." These verses are representative of the Holy Spirit who wells up inside us. He comforts, instructs and keeps us satisfied. It is important for the kids to see that if they believe in Jesus they should receive the Holy Spirit. If they have believed and received the Holy Spirit, their lives would be led by the Spirit. The gifts of the Spirit are available to all who believe! What an incredible blessing for the kids to be able to live a Spirit led life starting now! We will be going into more detail about the gifts and how to use them in our everyday lives.

In chapter 8, we will be concentrating on Jesus' words. He made some bold statements in this chapter. We should not fear man, but instead, we can be just as bold when we are speaking truth. In this chapter, Jesus stood up for the woman caught in adultery, and confronted the Pharisees who were still bound by the law. We as Christians must realize that even when we are persecuted for speaking the truth (in love), we are still honoring our Father. We can live a life FREE from condemnation, guilt, sickness, and sin. John 8:31 and 32 says, "Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on Him, If ye continue in My word, then are ye My disciples indeed; And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free".

We are entering a new month as well as a new unit. Unit 3—Advocates of Justice for All. This unit places emphasis on Generosity. This unit begins with Lesson 9: Our Redeemer Comes. Lesson Scripture: Isaiah 59:15-21; Lesson Focus: God is the only One who is able to redeem us. In this lesson we will discuss some of the things that we have already been redeemed from and different ways God redeems us and how we grasp His hand of salvation. We will learn why the Jews couldn't redeem themselves (which is the same for us today) and what God did to remedy this for them and us.

God's chosen people Israel were called to be holy and when they failed in this respect and fell into sin, God had to discipline them; however, they didn't have to endure that suffering into eternity. God reached out to them with His own arm of salvation and redeemed the in a way that they couldn't do for themselves because they did not earn it; His love and compassion for them gave them the right to His redemption of salvation. Isaiah told the Israelites that God was the only one who could truly save them, and that the only way they could benefit from this was by repenting from their sins and making a commitment to reform their ways.




