
'How can you say that?' asked the surprised barber. 'I am here, and I am a barber. And I just worked on you!'

- 20 And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told unto them.



All About Me "Fritiqua Wilson"



Matthew 7:7-8 "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you: For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened."

This favorite Scripture of Fritiqua Wilson, better known as "Teka," has taught her that no matter what you are looking for or asking for, if you have prayed, and have been looking or asking for something, it will be made visible and given to you. You just have to be still and wait; which is the hardest thing one can do...

Teka has attended The Shield of Faith Church for over nine (9) years and has been saved for four (4) years. She has truly influenced many with her godly counsel and has been a hope for those who don't know where to turn. People are drawn to her strength and are able to talk to her about anything. Teka's other favorite Scripture is Romans 12:9-21; Even though we have the tendencies to do what we want to do, these Scriptures tell us EXACTLY how we should behave as Christians. Please take the time to read them on page five (5).

We appreciate you Teka! You are a light in the darkness for so many in need and God honors your love and faithfulness towards those who are seeking... We can foresee many coming to the Lord through your service to Him! AMEN!



In Ps. I1:3 we read, "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" A quick answer is, do the opposite: "...build the old waste places; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations..." (Isa. 58:12). But just what are these foundations that need restoration?

One component of the foundations is honor. Actually, there are two components here: honor toward the Lord, and honor toward men.

The first four of the Ten Commandments relate to honoring God. No surprise here! There are additional aspects as well. For example, Prov. 3:9 reads, "Honor the Lord with your possessions, and with the firstfruits of all your increase." And if we can dishonor God by breaking the Law (Rom. 2:23), we can honor Him by doing His commandments.

Jesus said, "He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent Him." (John 5:23) This shows that honor and dishonor can be discerned in a broader context. Another example of this appears in Matt. 10:41a, "He who receives a prophet in the name of a prophet shall receive a prophet's reward."

The way we treat other men is often indicative of our attitude toward God. Consider Mal. I:6, 8 which asks, "A son honors his father, and a servant his master. If then I am the Father, where is My honor? And if I am a Master, where is My reverence? says the Lord of Hosts ... And when you offer the blind as a sacrifice, is it not evil? And when you offer the lame and the sick, is it not evil? Offer it then to your governor! Would he be pleased with you? Would he accept you favorably? says the Lord of hosts." We see Heaven is well aware of the connection!

If we are looking for opportunities to honor, many candidates are available. There are kings (I Pet. 2:17), spiritual leaders (Heb. 13:17), those who are older (Lev. 19:32), husbands (Eph. 5:24, 33), and parents (Ex. 20:12).

We don't see a whole lot of honor being expressed these days. Our culture seems to be more characterized by Isa. 3:5b, "...the child will be insolent toward the elder, and the base toward the honorable." Part of this comes from the thinking that we are all equal. It is true that we are all equal before the law, and should be since God is no respecter of persons (Col. 3:25). But this doesn't mean that we all hold equal rank; according I Cor. 12:28, obviously not. Even in the Millennium there will be inequality in authority, as in Jer. 31:34, "...they shall all know Me, from the least of them to the greatest of them, says the Lord ..."

In I John 4:20 we read, "...he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen?" If we were to replace the word "love" by the word "honor," we would find another wise saying.

Honoring your father and mother is at a level of importance that places it among the Ten Commandments. It's because honor is learned within the family context. Unfortunately, there are many young people today who don't even know who their father is. So, families too are part of the foundation that needs restoration. The Church has an opportunity to expand its honoring of the Lord by broadening our perspective of His mandate for us upon the earth.


