Who is responsible for the Christian education of my children? The Church OR the home? Scripture tells us how to bring up our children:

Deuteronomy 6:4-7 (Amplified) - 4"Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God is one Lord [the only Lord]. ⁵ And you shall love the Lord your God with all your

[mind and] heart and with your entire being and with all your might. ⁶ And these words which I am commanding you this day shall be [first] in your [own] minds and hearts; [then] ⁷You shall whet and sharpen them so as to make them penetrate, and teach and impress them diligently upon the [minds and] hearts of your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down and when you rise up."

= Informal instruction. Both are needed in the home. Moses is also Teach/Talk saying parents have the key to spiritual learning by the reality of the home. In other words, if you can live Jesus in the home, you can show Jesus to the world; through you. Home is reality. You can use opportunities in the home to commune God's word. In the home, God's word comes alive. Moses speaks about how to do these things in verse 7.

Sit

= Communicate God's word by sitting down with the family.

Walk

= Your actions at home. Your child will be impressed by lesus Christ in your life—actions speak louder than words.

Lie Down

= Take time to talk to your child from God's word about the actions of the day.

Rise Up

= Spend time with your child. Do things with them. You can't plug into your child's life on your time, but that of your child's time and needs.

In other words, eat, sleep, and live Jesus!

Youth Talk "Staying Within The Boundaries That God Sets"



What a special learning time our Youth enjoyed with Mr. Willie Preston when he spoke at one of our meetings in November. He emphasized the importance of following and honoring boundaries that are given to us by the Word of God, our parents, pastors, leaders, bosses, policemen, law givers, etc. If boundaries are not established and kept sacred, we as people tend to wander off into the enemy territory and away from safety. The boundaries that are established in a Christian's life are placed there by God Himself for a special purpose.

I remember as a ten year old helping my granddad maintain 'order in the pasture.' The horses didn't really enjoy it when we had to put them in a much smaller stall at

night, especially since they knew how much they enjoyed roaming the wide open pasture during the day. This particular occasion is when one of the horses got loose. He had managed to get out of his stall, but was still confined in between the walls of the barn. Needless to say, he wasn't happy. He began to fiercely kick at the barn door attempting to get out. What the horse didn't know, is that the door he was pounding on led him straight into a world with no boundaries, no fence, no protection, no food, no help, and dangerous conditions to include a nearby street. There was definitely a better way out. Granddad managed to get to the other side of the barn and gently lead the horse to the pasture by persuading him to go out the correct door. The horse was happy to be back in his boundaries eating his food!

Once a horse is trained properly by it's owner, it can maintain a strong discipline and continue quite well outside of the gate... with it's guide. We as Christians should be ALLOWING our Guide, the Holy Spirit, to train us, change us, and correct us when needed. It is important to humble ourselves as parents, leaders, and Christians under the mighty hand of God (I Peter 5) so that those watching us can see a life submitted to the boundaries of God's Holy Word.

We can be so much like a horse at times. We all, including our Youth, want freedom; freedom to roam, explore, and enjoy life. However, freedom does not mean that we have freedom to sin. It is our goal as Youth Leaders to obey God and train our Youth to follow Him with all of their heart, mind, soul, and strength. We ask you to continue to pray for us as we lead these incredible kids in a closer walk with Jesus.

- ⁸ I [the Lord] will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with My eye upon you. ⁹ Be not like the horse or the mule, which lack understanding, which must have their mouths held firm with bit and bridle, or else they will not come with you. ¹⁰ Many are the sorrows of the wicked, but he who trusts in, relies on, *and* confidently leans on the Lord shall be compassed about with mercy *and* with loving-kindness. ¹¹ Be glad in the Lord and rejoice, you [uncompromisingly] righteous [you who are upright and in right standing with Him]; shout for joy, all you upright in heart!

All About Me "Linda Butler"



Linda began attending church as a young child and committed her life totally to the Lord in 1976 after being married to an unbeliever and not attending church for about 4 years. She has attended the Shield of Faith for almost 30 years.

Linda was born in Santa Monica, California. After losing their first child at child-birth, Linda's mother and father were exceedingly happy to have a healthy baby girl. During Linda's first 6 years of life the family moved between southern California and southern Texas several times, then to Indiana and Delaware. When she was in Ist grade Linda's father took a job in Philadelphia and the family moved to New Jersey.

During high school Linda was active in the band, youth group, and Girl Scouts. As a teenager her youth group visited the Vineland School in Vineland, New Jersey. There she was exposed to children with special needs for the first time. From that point on she knew she wanted to work with special needs children in some capacity. After graduating in the top 10 of her high school class, Linda went to the Uni-

versity of Georgia in Athens, Georgia. During her sophomore year at UGA Linda's parents moved to Japan where her father was the United States representative in a joint venture with a Japanese company. During that time Linda lived in the Sigma Kappa sorority house and considered her sorority sisters her family. Because she had no family to return to during the summer, Linda continued with summer classes and completed a 5 year program in 4 years. She graduated in August 1971 with a BSHE (Bachelor of Science in Home Economics) degree with a double major in Child Development and Mental Retardation. She then continued her schooling and graduated the following summer with a MEd (Master of Education) degree majoring in special education.

Linda taught mildly mentally disabled children in Georgia for one year and she then taught moderate to severe mentally disabled children until her first child was born. After being a stay-at-home mom for almost 6 years with her 3 preschool children, she became a single parent. She returned to teaching to support her children and also attended The Citadel in the evenings. In addition, she also taught 3-4 year olds in Sunday school and held an office in the church. She graduated Summa Cum Laude with an EdS (Educational Specialist) degree in May 1987. As a school psychologist Linda was able to continue working with special needs children — only in a different capacity this time. Her role consisted of doing psychoeducational evaluations, developing individualized educational, behavioral, and transitions plans, and consulting with related service providers and outside agencies. After teaching for 10 years and being a school psychologist for 25 years, Linda retired in November 2013.


Linda has been married to her husband Frank for 27 years. Together they have 7 children and 11 grandchildren. Now that she is down to one full-time job (housewife), she has more time to devote to her knitting and counted cross stitch projects. She also enjoys shopping, reading, and eating lunch with her friends.

Linda considers herself a servant and worshipper. She enjoys helping and caring for others, spending time in the Word, and listening to Christian music.

<u>Joseph Prince</u> "Partake Expecting Deliverance"



"And thus you shall eat it: with a belt on your waist, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. So you shall eat it in haste. It is the Lord's Passover."

Exodus 12:11

Chew on this interesting truth: On the night of the first Passover, God told the Israelites in Egypt to eat the roasted lamb

with their belts and sandals on, and with their staffs in their hands. A strange instruction, don't you think? Why did God want them to eat the Passover that way? What was He saying to them?

God was saying, "Get ready! Get ready to get out!" In other words, they were to eat the Passover lamb with a readiness to leave Egypt, the land in which they were slaves to Pharaoh. They were to eat the lamb expecting deliverance out of Egypt. They were all dressed up with somewhere to go!

Now, we know that the Passover meal is a shadow of the Lord's Supper or Holy Communion, which Jesus instituted on the night He was betrayed. So when we partake of the Lord's Supper today, we are to partake with the same attitude that the Israelites had. In other words, when we eat the Lord's Supper, God wants us to expect deliverance from *whatever* enslaves us, whether it's depression, a physical condition or financial lack!

Today, partake of the Lord's Supper with a readiness for your deliverance. As you meditate on what Christ at the cross has done for you, expect to be healed. Expect the situation in your marriage to improve. Expect the best to happen to you! And as the Israelites walked out of the land of their bondage shortly after partaking of the lamb, so will you experience your breakthrough!

"Jesus Brings Real Change"

"Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God."

Philippians 4:6

Ever tried to change a person you care about? What we need to realize is that people are not transformed by threats or intimidation. Neither are they transformed by nagging or wheedling. Only God can truly transform a person.

My friend, what all the nagging, threatening or wheedling in the world cannot do, Jesus can. And when Jesus transforms a person, it's the real thing. It's not behavior modification, but heart transformation—from inside out!

All our self-efforts to try to change a person won't work. Change that is brought about by our machinations and manipulation won't last. Maybe you have been nagging at a loved one, trying to change him or her for the better, but with no results, and you are getting frustrated, anxious and desperate. The best thing you can do is to let go and let God handle it. Stop nagging and bring the matter to God in *prayer*, and watch Him do a deep and perfect work in your loved one that will astound you!

The Days of Lot

(We want to encourage you to look up the Scripture references as you read.)



After Jesus departed from the Temple, He answered those disciples who asked Him about the end times on the Mount of Olives (Mark 13:3-4). This is when Jesus compared the end times to the days of Lot, as recorded in Luke 17:28-33. It is well known that the most spectacular event in the life of Lot was the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah. Actually, Admah and Zeboiim were the third and fourth cities overthrown in that judgment (Deuteronomy 29:23). There is little doubt that there will be some cities destroyed in these end times, though we don't necessarily know which ones.

However, the days of Lot are characterized in more, though less spectacular, ways. We can expect that some contemporary Christians share in Lot's character. Yet, the scripture does state that Lot was right-eous (2 Peter 2:7-8). He was vexed by the frequent wicked deeds in Sodom. On the other hand, Lot chose to reside in that area (Genesis 13:9-11); he could have lived elsewhere. Perhaps he felt that his righteousness could remain intact in that environment. This proved to be technically correct; however, he lost some family members in the process.

When Lot warned his sons-in-law about the need to evacuate, he seemed to them to be joking. Why? They had probably seen him as living a life of compromise. In addition, Lot was fearful. He asked the angels if he could flee to Zoar, because of fear of danger in the mountains. But he ended up in a mountain cave anyway, since he was afraid of remaining in Zoar. This points to another characteristic: Lot was a poor decision maker.

Here is a good illustration of God's mercy. Lot was permitted to seek refuge in Zoar even though God was well aware of Lot's instability. In addition, the Lord spared Zoar upon Lot's request, although that town appeared on God's nuke list. Some unlikely Christians are going to be used as deliverers. Our words carry more weight in heaven than we perceive.


Debauchery is not the only reason why the Lord might consider the nuclear option for a certain city. As Matthew 22:7 states, "But when the king heard about it, he was furious. And he sent out his armies, destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city." Check out the context if you will!

It is easy to overlook the fact that the days of Lot are also the days of Abraham. To begin with, Abraham was a friend of God (John 15:14-15). The Lord informed Abraham what His intentions were, and that led to Abraham's opportunity to move powerfully as an intercessor (Genesis 18:16-32). When the Lord offered to spare Sodom for fifty righteous men, Abraham pleaded for reducing that number to ten. I believe Abraham was really interceding for Lot, and God knew there were not ten righteous in the city, but He saw Abraham's heart, and preserved Lot's life. We also recognize that Abraham is the father of faith. I am expecting some manifestations of mountain moving faith!

Abraham was not the only intercessor in the days of Lot, but the others are unnamed. As an outcry came up to heaven during the oppression by Egypt, so there was an outcry regarding Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 18:20-21, 19:13), and it appears to have preceded Abraham's intercession. I believe that outcries are ascending again to heaven at the present time!

A Servant



Merely a Christian or are you God's servants and handmaidens? "Servants and handmaidens" in Acts 2:18 in Greek is translated 'doulos' which refers to someone who has voluntarily subjected himself to another person's will. It describes a bond slave who could be free if he wanted to be but chooses instead to be wholly subservient to another because of his love for that person.

If you are a servant or handmaiden, you will be committed to the Lord Jesus. It is not a commitment He forces upon you. It is one that you make by choice, because you love Him. When you were born again, you did not become a hired servant of God. You be-

came a child of God; son or daughter of the Almighty. You were made free and "if the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed (John 8:36).

But if you truly love the One who set you free, you will trade that freedom for a life of service to Him. That's what the Apostle Paul did in Romans 1:1; he calls himself 'a bond servant of Jesus Christ.' Choose today to be a bond servant; one who longs to stay close to the Master's side, serving Him wholeheartedly from a heart of love and devotion. Choose to be one of God's servants and handmaidens.

I am not enslaved by sin. I am free to be a servant of Jesus Christ. I choose His will above my own.

John 8:34-36 (Amplified) - ³⁴ Jesus answered them, I assure you, most solemnly I tell you, Whoever commits *and* practices sin is the slave of sin. ³⁵ Now a slave does not remain in a household permanently (forever); the son [of the house] does remain forever. ³⁶ So if the Son liberates you [makes you free men], then you are really *and* unquestionably free.



Matthew 2

Amplified Bible (AMP)

- Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men [astrologers] from the east came to Jerusalem, asking,
- ² Where is He Who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the east at its rising and have come to worship Him.
- ³ When Herod the king heard this, he was disturbed and troubled, and the whole of Jerusalem with him.
- ⁴So he called together all the chief priests and learned men (scribes) of the people and anxiously asked them where the Christ was to be born.
- ⁵ They replied to him, In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet:
- ⁶ And you Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are not in any way least or insignificant among the chief cities of Judah; for from you shall come a Ruler (Leader) Who will govern and shepherd My people Israel.
- ⁷ Then Herod sent for the wise men [astrologers] secretly, and accurately to the last point ascertained from them the time of the appearing of the star [that is, how long the star had made itself visible since its rising in the east].
- ⁸ Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, Go and search for the Child carefully *and* diligently, and when you have found Him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship Him.
- ⁹ When they had listened to the king, they went their way, and behold, the star which had been seen in the east in its rising went before them until it came and stood over the place where the young Child was.
- ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they were thrilled with ecstatic joy.
- ¹¹ And on going into the house, they saw the Child with Mary His mother, and they fell down and worshiped Him. Then opening their treasure bags, they presented to Him gifts—gold and frankincense and myrrh.
- ¹² And receiving an answer to their asking, they were divinely instructed *and* warned in a dream not to go back to Herod; so they departed to their own country by a different way.
- ¹³ Now after they had gone, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, Get up! [Tenderly] take *unto you* the young Child and His mother and flee to Egypt; and remain there till I tell you [otherwise], for Herod intends to search for the Child in order to destroy Him.
- ¹⁴ And having risen, he took the Child and His mother by night and withdrew to Egypt
- ¹⁵ And remained there until Herod's death. This was to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet, Out of Egypt have I called My Son.

Keep Holidays Bright When Shopping This Year

In 2011, the <u>U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC)</u> estimated that hospital emergency rooms across the country treated 262,300 toy-related injuries. And, 74 percent of those injuries were to children under the age of 15. In fact, more than 92,000 were to those under 5 years of age.

Because the most commonly injured part of the body is the head and face area, Prevent Blindness America has declared **December as Safe Toys and Gifts Month** in an effort to help adults make the best decisions on how to keep the holiday season joyful for everyone.

Prevent Blindness America suggests that before purchasing a toy, to consider the following:

- · Read all warnings and instructions on the box.
- Ask yourself or the parent if the toy is right for the child's ability and age.
- · Avoid purchasing toys with sharp or rigid points, spikes, rods, or dangerous edges.
- Check the lenses and frames of children's sunglasses; many can break and cause injuries.
- Buy toys that will withstand impact and not break into dangerous shards.
- Look for the letters "ASTM." This designation means the product meets the national safety standards set by the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM).
- · Avoid toys that shoot or include parts that fly off.
- Gifts of sports equipment should always be accompanied by protective gear (such as a basketball along with eye goggles or a face guard with a new batting helmet for baseball or softball).
- Don't give toys with small parts to young children. Young kids tend to put things in their mouths, increasing the risk of choking. If the part of a toy can fit in a toilet paper roll, the toy is not appropriate for children under the age of 3.
- Do not purchase toys with long strings or cords, especially for infants and very young children as this can become wrapped around a child's neck.
- Always dispose of uninflated or broken balloons immediately. According to the CPSC, more children have suffocated from them than any other type of toy.



Sunday School Events

Children's Sunday School Ages 6-11

For the month of December, the children's Sunday school class will be starting Unit 4 in the Dare to be a Daniel training course. Unit 4 is our 4th "P" and is titled "Point the Way to God".

First of all, we will be discussing how to **POINT** to God by sharing His love. It is not enough to just know that God loves us, but we need to know that God also offers forgiveness for our sins. We also need to be sure to love others with the same love and patience that God shows us. If we do not receive His love for ourselves, how can we share His love with others? Also, we will be focusing on the Biblical fact that sin separates us from God. We will not be a quality example for others if our actions, words and attitudes are not like His. We need to be aware that others are watching our every move, and we have to be bold in our decision to follow God.

Secondly, our children will learn to **POINT** to God by telling others about Jesus. This session is important, because our little soul winners will learn to share with others the nonnegotiable truth that Jesus is the only Way. Certainly, some will try to resist and protest this fact and even become offended, so our children need the proper foundation to share this truth. John 14:6 says, "Jesus answered, 'I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me". We will also be going through the final steps of telling others how they can personally trust Him.

Thirdly, our children will learn to **POINT** to God by putting their faith into action. We will talk about servant leadership, and how committed kids can be called to lead others to Jesus Christ just as much as any adult Christian. Young people earn a right to speak by example, and when their actions match their words, they gain respect. One of the most important elements to effectively **POINT** the way to God is by our testimony. We will delve deeper into the meaning and importance of the word, "testimony".

Finally, our children will learn to **POINT** to God by telling others how He has changed their lives. I Peter 3:15 says, "But in your hearts set apart Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect". While it is important to have our theology correct and be able to show someone how to accept the Lord Jesus, we need to be aware that non-Christians will be drawn to us Christians, because of what they see in us.

To end this session, we will be talking about Paul's own faith story as written in Acts 21-22. What an example we have in Scripture with regards to the testimony of Paul. Tremendous! I love the story of Paul!

Please don't let your children miss these sessions as we celebrate the most important birth of all. Salvation could never be possible without the birth of our precious Lord Jesus!!!


