

Recipe of the Month Coconut-Lemon Cake

Ingredients:

I cup unsalted butter, softened

2 cups sugar

4 large eggs, separated

3 cups all-purpose flour

I tablespoon baking powder

I cup milk

I teaspoon vanilla extract

1/8 teaspoon salt

*Lemon Filling

**Fluffy White Frosting

I cup flaked coconut

Garnishes: fresh cranberries, fresh boxwood sprigs



Directions:

I. Beat butter at medium speed with an electric mixer until fluffy; gradually add sugar, beating well. Add egg yolks, one at a time, beating after each addition.

2. Combine flour and baking powder; add to butter mixture alternately with milk, beginning and ending with flour mixture. Beat at low speed until blended after each addition. Stir in 1 tsp. vanilla.

3. Beat egg whites and salt at high speed with an electric mixer until stiff peaks form. Stir about one-third of egg whites into batter; fold in remaining egg whites. Spoon batter into 3 greased and floured 9-inch round cake pans.

4. Bake at 350° for 18 to 20 minutes or until a wooden pick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pans on wire racks 10 minutes; remove from pans, and cool completely on wire racks.

5. Spread Lemon Filling between layers. Spread Fluffy White Frosting on top and sides of cake. Sprinkle top and sides with coconut; garnish, if desired.

Note: Boxwood is poisonous if ingested. If boxwood sprigs are used as garnish, cut small circle of heavy-duty plastic wrap, and position in center of cake before arranging sprigs and cranberries on top of cake. **Remove garnish before serving.**

*Lemon Filing

I cup sugar I/4 cup cornstarch I cup boiling water 4 egg yolks, lightly beaten 1/3 cup fresh lemon juice 2 tablespoons butter

I. Combine sugar and cornstarch in a medium saucepan; stir in I cup boiling water. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until sugar and cornstarch dissolve (about 3 minutes). Gradually stir about one-fourth of hot mixture into yolks; add to remaining hot mixture, stirring constantly with a wire whisk. Stir in lemon juice.

2. Cook, stirring constantly, until thickened. Remove from heat; stir in butter. Cool, stirring occasionally.

**Fluffy White Frosting

l cup sugar

4 egg whites

1 1/2 cups water

1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar

2 tablespoons light corn syrup

1. Combine first 3 ingredients in a small heavy saucepan; cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until clear. Cook, without stirring, until mixture reaches soft-ball stage or candy thermometer registers 240°.

2. Beat egg whites and cream of tartar at high speed with an electric mixer until soft peaks form; slowly add syrup, beating constantly. Beat until stiff peaks form and frosting is desired consistency.

Keep Focused



Always Good News.

Question:

Every year, we say we're going to try to keep our children's attention focused on the real meaning of Christmas, but then all our good intentions go out the window once the holiday approaches. Is it hopeless to keep trying?

Answer:

No, it's not hopeless — and even if it seems difficult, I believe it's important to keep trying. After all, if your children don't learn the true meaning of Christmas at home, where will they learn it in today's world? They probably won't.


At the same time, be sure you take into account their ages and attention spans. Children don't necessarily respond to long Bible readings or extended prayers; they may even rebel against them if we aren't careful. Instead, you may want to take a few minutes each day to focus on one truth about Jesus and one fact about His birth. Simply but clearly teach your children who Jesus was and why He came into the world. Underline, too, that Jesus came because God loves us and wants us to be part of His family forever — and we will be, as we ask Jesus to come into our hearts.

Remember that the greatest "teacher" your children will ever have isn't only our words, but our lives. Do we tell them Jesus is important to us, but then act as if He isn't? Do we become so preoccupied with shopping and other activities this time of year that they conclude this must be all there is to Christmas?

Christmastime gives parents a great opportunity to help their children discover who Jesus is and what He wants to do for them. Remember the Bible's promise: "Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it" (Proverbs 22:6).

The holidays are almost upon us, and usually this is the time of year where my hopes and dreams tend to be renewed within my heart. This was not the case a few years back, however.

I felt like my life had fallen to a new low when my Jewish neighbor asked me to watch her dog so she could celebrate Christmas with her in-laws. When I initially declined she said, "Oh come on. You are single with no family. What does it matter if you stay at my house? You don't have anywhere to go."

Emotionally, I knew it mattered a great deal, but I had grown weary from the years of praying for the healing I needed in order to be connected with my loved

ones so I could spend the holidays (and life in general) with them. I reluctantly agreed to watch the dog and stayed at her home, but as the days crept toward the 24th, my heart became more and more despondent.

It's been a longtime habit of mine to slip outside on Christmas Eve to pray, and that night was no different. The stillness of the December air that manages to turn crisp just in the nick of time in South Carolina and the extraordinarily bright moonlight somehow have always made the atmosphere seem truly holy to me. I am usually then moved to offer up my deepest, most heartfelt thoughts and feelings to God with ease. It's not uncommon for me to pray for a "Christmas miracle," either, and that year I did have a particular one in mind.

But rather than being able to speak, unexpectedly there were no words. There were not even tears. Instead I stood in the depths of a lifetime of emptiness. Not being able to take the pain of the disconnect even with Jesus, I told Him, "I have nothing to say. My hope is gone. I don't believe in Christmas miracles anymore. Your birth was probably it--the only Christmas miracle necessary, and that should be enough for me." Then I dejectedly went back into the house without even saying an amen.

It wasn't long after that when the dog and I headed to bed. Normally, it takes me well over an hour to fall asleep, yet within minutes I was out. Visions of sugarplums did not dance in my head, but sometime during the night I began to dream, and in my dream, I sat at a writing desk in a small room.

I tried hard to put pen to paper but because of an overwhelming anxiety, I got up from the desk and then began to pace. I was so caught up in my fear that when three men appeared in the room, I almost didn't notice them. They all had dark hair and were dressed like monks. Their habits were brown and the men wore golden sashes tied around their waists. They also all held golden tablets in their hands.

One of the men stepped forward. He simply said, "My name is Sean. I have a message for you. Do not be afraid." As soon as he said this, peace flooded me so deeply that I felt a change in my body even in my sleep, which caused me to wake with a joyful start.

I excitedly thought, "If the name Sean has anything to do with God, then my dream was from the Lord!" I sprang out of bed and tripped over the dog which nearly sent me flying head first down the stairs, but I hardly cared. I just wanted to get to the computer to find out about this name.

Sean, it turns out, is the Gaelic form of John which means, "God is gracious." This discovery only heightened my joy. By giving me that dream, the Lord indeed had shown Himself to be gracious to me.

- ⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the town of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David,
- ⁵To be enrolled with Mary, his espoused (married) wife, who was about to become a mother.

- ¹³ Then suddenly there appeared with the angel an army of the troops of heaven (a heavenly knighthood), praising God and saying,
- ¹⁴ Glory to God in the highest [heaven], and on earth peace among men with whom He is well pleased [men of goodwill, of His favor].
- ¹⁵ When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said one to another, Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing (saying) that has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us.
- ¹⁶ So they went with haste and [by searching] found Mary and Joseph, and the Baby lying in a manger.
- ¹⁷ And when they saw it, they made known what had been told them concerning this Child,
- ¹⁸ And all who heard it were astounded and marveled at what the shepherds told them.
- ¹⁹ But Mary was keeping within herself all these things (sayings), weighing and pondering them in her heart.
- ²⁰ And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, just as it had been told them.

Health Check

As the holiday season marches ahead, so does toy shopping for the special children in our lives. There are thousands of toys to choose from and selecting the right one can be a challenge, especially as new toys appear on the shelves every year. Toys are intended to be fun and enjoyable for children, but they can pose serious health risks if they are not properly made and designed.

In 2011, an estimated 262,300 toy-related injuries were treated in U.S. hospital emergency departments — 72 percent of which happened to children 15 years old or younger. Sometimes, choosing the right toy can be difficult, and a typical toy store can easily overwhelm even the shrewdest shopper. When evaluating what toys to buy this year, consider the following:

- I. Children under three years old tend to put everything in their mouths, so avoid buying toys that have small parts and may pose a choking danger. Look for quality in design and construction, and follow age and safety recommendations on labels.
- 2. Consider purchasing a small parts tester to determine whether small toys for children under the age of three might present a choking hazard.
- 3. Toys with strings, straps, or cords longer than seven inches may pose a risk of strangulation.
- 4. Toys that are constructed with thin, brittle plastic might easily break into small pieces or leave jagged edges.
- 5. Avoid cap guns because the caps can be ignited by the slightest friction and cause serious burns.
- 6. Avoid toys with sharp points or edges, toys that produce loud sounds, or projectiles (such as dart and firing rockets).
- 7. If you buy a bicycle for a child, buy a helmet too and make sure the child wears it.
- 8. Make recommendations to family members and friends about gifts that you feel are appropriate for your child.
- 9. Inspect all toys as much as possible before taking them out of the box. Once opened, go through each part of the toy to make sure there are no small parts that could be choking hazards.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) oversees the safety of toys and many other consumer products, and requires toy manufacturers to meet stringent safety standards. 

"Pray the Prayer of Jabez!"

"Jabez was more honorable than his brothers.

His mother had named him Jabez, saying, "I gave birth to him in pain." Jabez cried out to the God of Israel, "Oh, that You would bless me and enlarge my territory!

Let Your hand be with me, and keep me from harm so that I will be free from pain." And God granted his request."

-I Chronicles 4:9-10, NIV

There was once a boy named Sorrow. His mother gave him that name because she bore him in pain. You can imagine that with a name like that, it's quite likely no one liked him.

So do you know what Sorrow, otherwise known as Jabez in the Old Testament, did? He called on the God of Israel to BLESS him! "Oh, that You would bless me and enlarge my territory..." That's asking God for provision and increase. He also asked for God's hand to be with him so that he would be blessed in all that he did and be protected from harm. God not only granted Jabez his request, but He also considered Jabez more honorable than his brothers!

"Transformation and Victory Through Beholding Jesus"

"But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord."

-2 Corinthians 3:18

The greatest miracle that Peter experienced happened one night when he stepped out of his boat in the middle of a storm at Jesus' word. That night, the winds were wild and the waves boisterous. As long as Peter kept his eyes on Jesus, he did the impossible—he walked on water.

Jesus was walking on the water and when Peter looked at Jesus, he became like Jesus and did the supernatural. God's Word declares that "we all, with unveiled face, **beholding** as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being **transformed into the same image** from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord."

Beloved, when you keep your focus on Jesus, you are transformed into His image from glory to glory. You are transformed by beholding, not by working. When you see that Jesus is above the storms of your life, you will effortlessly rise above those storms.

So instead of looking at how insurmountable your circumstances and challenges are, turn away from them and keep your eyes on Jesus. While it may sound impractical, it is the most powerful thing you can do, and Jesus will cause you to reign over every storm in your life!

Yet later on Christmas Day, after happily sharing my story with a friend (who has been a church leader for more than 35 years), she simply smiled but did not comment. Concerned, I asked, "Do you not think this was from God?" She answered, "Yes it was, but those men were not monks, and that was not a dream. They were angels, and you experienced a visitation."

I fell silent. I realized God's graciousness to me had been far greater than I initially understood. To begin with, many people pray to see angels and often ask how that happens. There is no definitive answer, but I've slowly come to the realization that angels are visible when we need them to be visible, but only God knows when we truly are in that place of need. This is not something we can force upon Him. Additionally having a spiritual experience does not make a person holy, which is not a claim I could ever make about myself. I am just as human as anyone else.

Secondly, I told the Lord I didn't believe in Christmas miracles anymore, but He performed one simply to restore my hope. It's been six years since that night, but I think of it more frequently now because like the angels announcing Christ's birth, they too brought me great tidings of joy that is just now beginning to manifest in my life.

Children's Sunday School

Ages 6-11


For the month of December, the Children's Sunday school class will be taking a trip back to Bethlehem. Our scripture reading will primarily be focused in Luke 2. In this class, the children will learn about God's promise that a Messiah would be born in the town of Bethlehem (Micah 5:2). We will be referring back to the verses in the Old Testament where it was prophesied that God would send us a Savior (2 Samuel 7:12-16). How important it is for the kids to know that God always keeps His promises, and His promise was fulfilled all the way to Calvary and beyond! Hallelujah! After His promise to send a Savior came to pass, we will speak further on God's promise of salvation to all who believe (John 3:16).

We will talk about the history of Bethlehem (also known as the town of David) before the birth of Jesus, and then what kind of town it was like during the time of His birth. As we walk through our journey with Mary and Joseph, we will encounter Gabriel and the shepherds who received the good news of His birth. In order to get a perspective on what these shepherds experienced, we are going to pretend how it must have been to be a shepherd in this day. This was not the ideal job even during the birth of Jesus; however, someone needed to do it, and these shepherds were obedient to their calling. It was during this time of responsibility when they were protecting their sheep that they received the good news of a Savior being born. When they received the message from the angels, they acted upon it, and went to see the Savior of the world. When they arrived in Bethlehem, they praised God for this great gift!

In addition, we will talk about the symbolism of the sheep's blood. In the Old Testament, the lamb was sacrificed for the purpose of covering their sins. So even though being a shepherd wasn't a popular job, it was quite an important one. The symbolism of the death of a Lamb was later shown to the world when Jesus was sacrificed, and His blood was shed at Calvary for the remission of our sins. (Hebrews 9:16). Just as the shepherds received the good news of a Savior being born, we are to share the Good News of His birth, burial and resurrection with others. We ALL require a Savior!

Of course, we go more in depth in our class, and I highly suggest you have your kids come to Sunday school. This is an important time that should not be wasted. "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth, peace, good will toward men" (Luke 2:14).




