

#### I Corinthians 12:4-12

<sup>5</sup>And there are differences of <u>administrations</u> (attendant, waiter, server, to run on errands, teacher, pastor, deacon, deaconess), but the same Lord (supreme authority, controller, master, Lord). <sup>6</sup>And there are diversities of operations (an effect, be active, efficient, effectual, powerful), but it is the same God (deity, magistrate, supreme divinity, God) which worketh all in all.

<sup>7</sup>But the manifestation (exhibition, expression) of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal (to bear together, contribute, a primary preposition denoting union or together).

<sup>8</sup>For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same

<sup>9</sup>To another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit;

<sup>10</sup>To another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues:

<sup>11</sup>But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as He will.

<sup>12</sup>For as the body is one, and hath many members, and all the members of that one body, being many, are one body: so also is Christ."


#### **Be Encouraged**



#### Manners and Customs of the Bible

#### The Royal Butler—Page 194

- Neh 1:1 The words of Nehemiah the son of Hachaliah. And it happened in the month Chisleu (around our December), in the twentieth year, as I was in Shushan the palace,
- Neh I:2 Hanani, one of my brothers, came, he and men of Judah. And I asked them concerning the Jews who had escaped, who were left of the captivity, and concerning Jerusalem.
- Neh 1:3 And they said to me, The remnant left of the captivity there in the province is in great affliction and shame. And the wall of Jerusalem is broken down, and its gates are burned with fire.
- Neh I:4 And it happened when I heard these words, I sat down and wept. And I mourned for days, and fasted, and prayed before the God of Heaven.
- Neh 1:5 And I said, I pray You, O Jehovah, the God of Heaven, the great and awesome God who keeps covenant and mercy for those who love Him and keep His commandments;
- Neh I:6 let Your ear now be open, and Your eyes open, so that You may hear the prayer of Your servant, which I pray before You now, day and night, for the sons of Israel Your servants, and confessing the sins of the sons of Israel which we have sinned against You. Both I and my father's house have sinned
- Neh 1:7 We have acted very wickedly against You, and have not kept the commandments nor the statutes nor the judgments which You commanded Your servant Moses.
- Neh I:8 I pray You, remember the Word that You commanded Your servant Moses, saying, If you sin, I will scatter you among the nations,
- Neh 1:9 but if you turn to Me, and keep My commandments and do them, though you were cast out to the outermost part of the heavens, yet I will gather you from there and will bring you to the place that I have chosen to set My name there.
- Neh 1:10 And these are Your servants and Your people whom You have redeemed by Your great power and by Your strong hand.
- Neh I:II O Jehovah, I pray You, let now Your ear be open to the prayer of Your servant, and to the prayer of Your servants who desire to fear Your name. And I pray You, bless Your servant today, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man. (For I was the king's cupbearer.)

Nehemiah was the Royal Butler. The office of royal cup-bearer or butler is of high antiquity, and was a place of great honor in the Persian court. The cup-bearer, being in the daily presence of the king, and seeing him at his seasons of relaxation from care, had many opportunities of ingratiating himself into the good-will of the monarch, and thus doubtless obtained many favors which were denied others. Cup-bearers were generally eunuchs, and are often found represented on Assyrian monuments. In these representations they hold the cup in the left hand, and in the right hand a fly-flap made of the split leaves of the palm. A long napkin, richly embroidered and fringed, is thrown over the left shoulder for the king to wipe his lips with. Among the Medes and Persians the cup-bearer, before serving the King, took the wine into the cup from the vessels, and then poured a little into the palm of his left hand and drank it; so that if the wine were poisoned the king might ascertain it without running any personal risk. Pharaoh had cup-bearers to attend him as well as Solomon.

1 Kings 17:12-14 MSG

12 She said, "I swear, as surely as your GOD lives, I don't have so much as a biscuit. I have a handful of flour in a jar and a little oil in a bottle; you found me scratching together just enough firewood to make a last meal for my son and me. After we eat it, we'll die."

13-14 Elijah said to her, "Don't worry about a thing. Go ahead and do what you've said. But first make a small biscuit for me and bring it back here. Then go ahead and make a meal from what's left for you and your son. This is the word of the GOD of Israel: 'The jar of flour will not run out and the bottle of oil will not become empty before GOD sends rain on the land and ends this drought."

I recently heard a sermon about this widow of Zeraphat and her last meal. I wonder how she felt at the prophet's request to cook him her last meal. Did she have a fit of carnality, pout, refuse, rationalize how she was not only going to die but die hungry, with her son? What kind of excuses was she making, 'I can't afford this, I'll give it next time, or "I have bills to pay and God is asking for too much." I have been in her shoes many times: I, too, tend to hold on to the purse strings pretty tightly and ask God to bend his principles for me so I don't have to give. Shameful....and sad.

What the widow did not see at first is the fact her last meal was the seed to activate her financial blessing. She was upset over having to give all she had but after the prophet gave her a snapshot of her future, she relented. But the story is not over. I don't think she believed God could still sustain her. Her son would of died and stayed dead had the prophet not come to the house in the first place, eaten her last spaghetti, and stayed. She finally realized God's hands were kept tied because of her unbelief. How are you doing with tithes and offerings? Are we eating our seed and robbing God? What's the promise for those of us, "we are cursed with a curse." (Malachi 3:8-10)

My husband and I grabbed on to giving when we attended The Shield of Faith Church 10 years ago. It was a struggle, more for him than for me, because logically it did not make sense to him but I saw the principle behind it. Anyway, we saw immediate results and have been tithing ever since. I am so thankful to God He changed my mind about money. We love to give: the recipients' faces are priceless and worth more than I could ever pay to see. Christmas time is coming, I know, but let's look at this from the kingdom point of view: which is better, obedience or sacrifice? That is a question each of us will have to answer when it comes time to spend money we don't have on presents or choose to continue to pay our tithes and offerings and have fewer presents.

Usually finances in churches plummet in December due to the shopping season. I am reminded of the cross, of all the things Jesus had to go through on Golgatha. The least I can do is obey His word and put Him first, even at Christmas, by making sure His house is in order. What else could we give Him? He already kind of has everything... hard to shop for someone like that. So, let's be thankful to Jesus for all He has done, that He saved us so we would not go to hell, and blessed us beyond measure in this life. I think that may be worth not eating our seed. Have a blessed Christmas and New Year!

Acts 13:47 For so the Lord has commanded us, *saying*, "I have set You to be a light of the nations, for salvation to the end of the earth."


Acts 13:48 And hearing, the nations rejoiced and glorified the Word of the Lord. And as many as were ordained to eternal life believed.

Acts 13:51 But shaking the dust of their feet off on them, they came into Iconium.


Acts 13:52 And the disciples were filled with joy and with *the* Holy Spirit.

From "Nina's Words for Life"

Isaiah 61:1-3 Amp

"THE SPIRIT of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed and qualified me to preach the Gospel of good tidings to the meek, the poor, and afflicted; He has sent me to bind up and heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the [physical and spiritual] captives and the opening of the prison and of the eyes to those who are bound.

<sup>2</sup>To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord [the year of His favor] [a] and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn,

<sup>3</sup>To grant [consolation and joy] to those who mourn in Zion-to give them an ornament (a garland or diadem) of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, the garment [expressive] of praise instead of a heavy, burdened, and failing spirit-that they may be called oaks of righteousness [lofty, strong, and magnificent, distinguished for uprightness, justice, and right standing with God], the planting of the Lord, that He may be glorified."

I was sitting down at my desk, talking to my Father about my worries and fears, missing my family who is far from me distance wise. I was wishing for the Publix Christmas commercial with perfect food, loving family and roomful of presents. That is not the case: all my husband's family members are dead, only have a few presents and will cook on a budget. As I was having a fit of carnality, Jesus stopped by and stayed with me awhile and that's how I came up with January's column.

Jesus reminded me of few things I had forgotten because my focus had shifted and I had let emotions and circumstances block Him from my view. I only tripped for a moment, and my tears were bottled.... lesus showed me the Publix commercial was a fake and all the people were acting. He also told me the best gifts could not be bought, as His gift of salvation, and that He knew what I needed the most and this season it was a present of my husband finding a job after two years of unemployment.

He also reminded me the New Year is coming but not to get too bogged down of making myself plans and resolutions I would not keep anyway. Instead, He suggested attending church regularly, no matter what, and renewing my mind in His word daily to keep my eyes on the real prize. He stated He was no fairy, but still has already gifted me with the famous three: love, peace and joy. He smiled and nodded, 'Yes, I can see you through the ceiling when you lift your hands and praise Me even when your heart is broken and your moped seems to be in the ditch." "But, my daughter,' He said, "I have already made you an overcomer who is holy and set apart for My use. I have important things for you to do but I need you to trust Me." Then He waved, turned, and walked away. He left me with hope and a sense He knows me better than I do and that makes Him "The God."

I was left at my keyboard, typing these words of encouragement for all who feel they have fallen short of the glory. As Isaiah 61 tells us, this next year will be great: comforting, unselfish, and most of all joyous and full of glory of God. So, whatever you are going through, read this scripture to find a God who is privy to our sorrows and regrets and secret wishes. And when life seems unlivable, finances ungiveable, and people unlovable, praise Him for all you've got and don't let the seen prevent the unseen from coming to pass this year. All of his promises are yea and amen and whatever we ask in His will, according to His word and doubt not, it will come to pass. Let's make 2012 a true Anno Domini, "The Year for Our God."

Some highlights from Adam Fowler's Family Newsletter:


