Youth Talk

“What the Bible Says About Beauty and Appearance”

I ran across this article on-line and felt that it was necessary to share with everyone. We are to build up one another and encourage one another... Have you told a Youth lately how special they really are?

Psalm 139:14

I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.

What it means: You are created in the image of God, and God doesn't make junk! Like a snowflake, every person is unique. No two are the same. God sees you as a masterpiece; and when you look in the mirror, He wants you to "know that full well." Try this beauty tip: Every morning when you look in the mirror, say Psalm 139:14 and smile. You might even tape the verse on your mirror as a reminder!

1 Samuel 16:7

But the LORD said to Samuel, "Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The LORD does not look at the things man looks at. Man looks at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart."

What it means: The world focuses on what people look like on the outside. God focuses on what people look like on the inside. Do you put more time and effort into being pretty on the outside or the inside? As you get older, you will meet Christian girls who spend more time trying to find the perfect outfit, get the perfect tan, find the perfect lip gloss, and have the perfect body. While there's nothing wrong with wanting to look pretty, we need to make sure it's in balance. God would rather see us work on becoming drop-dead gorgeous on the inside. You know, the kind of girl who talks to Him on a regular basis (prayer) and reads her Bible.

Proverbs 31:30

Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the LORD is to be praised.

What it means: Beauty fades with age, so if you are more concerned with your outer appearance, you will be unhappy when the wrinkles come and the number on the scale goes up. In fact, did you know that your body may show the beginning signs of aging as early as age twenty? That is why God wants us to "fear" Him. That doesn't mean to be afraid of Him but rather to be in awe of Him and all that He has done. Let me put it to you this way. If you stand two girls next to each other and one is Miss Teen USA whose beauty is limited to physical beauty, and the other young lady is a more average-looking girl who loves the Lord more than anything, she is the more beautiful girl in the eyes of God.

1 Peter 3:3-4

Your beauty should not come from outward adornment, such as braided hair and the wearing of gold jewelry and fine clothes. Instead, it should be that of your inner self, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is of great worth in God's sight.

What it means: This does not mean it's wrong to braid your hair or wear nice clothes and jewelry. The verse was written to warn women not to follow the customs of some of the Egyptian women who, during that time period, spent hours and hours working on their hair, makeup, and finding the perfect outfit. God would rather see women work on becoming beautiful on the inside — the kind of beauty that lasts forever.

1 Timothy 4:8

Physical exercise has some value, but spiritual exercise is much more important, for it promises a reward in both this life and the next.

What it means: Exercising and staying in shape is a good thing, but God expects us to stay in shape spiritually by reading our Bibles, praying, and going to church on a regular basis. In other words, there will be plenty of people who put their time and effort into staying in shape but who are out of shape spiritually. If they don't know Jesus Christ, their perfect bodies won't get them through the gates of heaven.

What's Going on Behind the Seen?

Recipe of the Month Garlic Roasted Potatoes

Ingredients:

3 pounds small red or white potatoes
1/4 cup good olive oil
1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt
1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
2 tablespoons minced garlic (6 cloves)
2 tablespoons minced fresh parsley

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.



Cut the potatoes in half or quarters and place in a bowl with the olive oil, salt, pepper, and garlic; toss until the potatoes are well coated. Transfer the potatoes to a sheet pan and spread out into 1 layer. Roast in the oven for 45 minutes to 1 hour or until browned and crisp. Flip twice with a spatula during cooking in order to ensure even browning.

Remove the potatoes from the oven, toss with parsley, season to taste, and serve hot.

"It's really nothing," he answered. "The number is on a piece of tape on the ceiling."

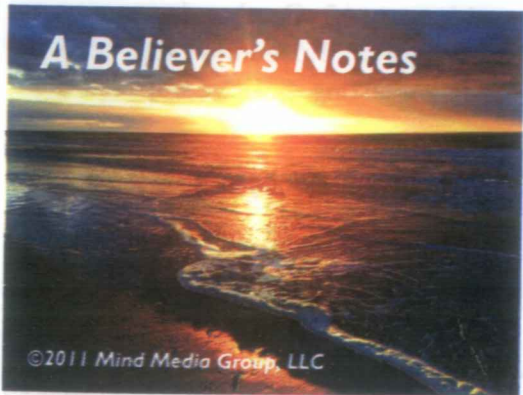

Get Aggressive!



***“O taste and see that the Lord is good:
blessed is the man that trusteth in Him.”***

—Psalm 34:8

Resist sickness, lack, and poverty! Apply your will and say, “I will prosper in the Name of Jesus,” and resist the curse. God says He has provided abundance, so abundance belongs to us (believers). We receive it now! That’s the kind of aggressive stand we need to establish God’s prosperity in our lives.

Don’t allow the devil to come in and give you a hard time in your finances. Use the same kind of stand for your finances as for healing (the same way you get aggressive for healing). Jesus bore our sickness, so refuse to put up with it any more! Don’t tolerate it. Consider sickness and enemy and when it tries to come into your house, stand against it! Tell it, “No! You get out of here! I’ve been redeemed from the curse of the law and that includes every sickness and disease. So get out!”

Treat lack the same way. Don’t put up with it. We have been redeemed from it. So resist it like you resist sickness and disease. Determine to make a change. Begin to actively, aggressively resist lack the same way you resist sickness and disease. It’s not east and it takes effort and perseverance.

Keep a constant dose of the Word in your heart. Mediate on what God says about it all the time. Refuse and resist the curse of lack, poverty, and sickness. Get aggressive! Speak the Word, “I am willing and obedient. I always eat the good of the land.” - Isaiah 1:19

Being willing means that you apply the force of your will and determine to receive by faith what God has promised; no matter how impossible the circumstances may seem to be.

Faith—Walk by faith, not by sight. Faith is of the heart—the Spirit—not the mind. To activate the believing equipment that God has given every person, one must believe something he cannot see or feel—the Word of God.

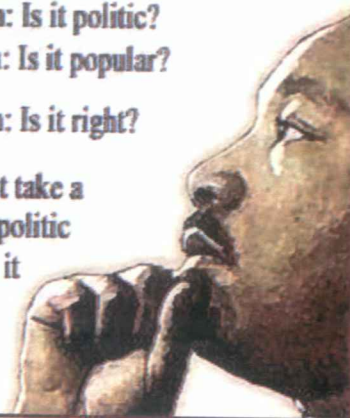

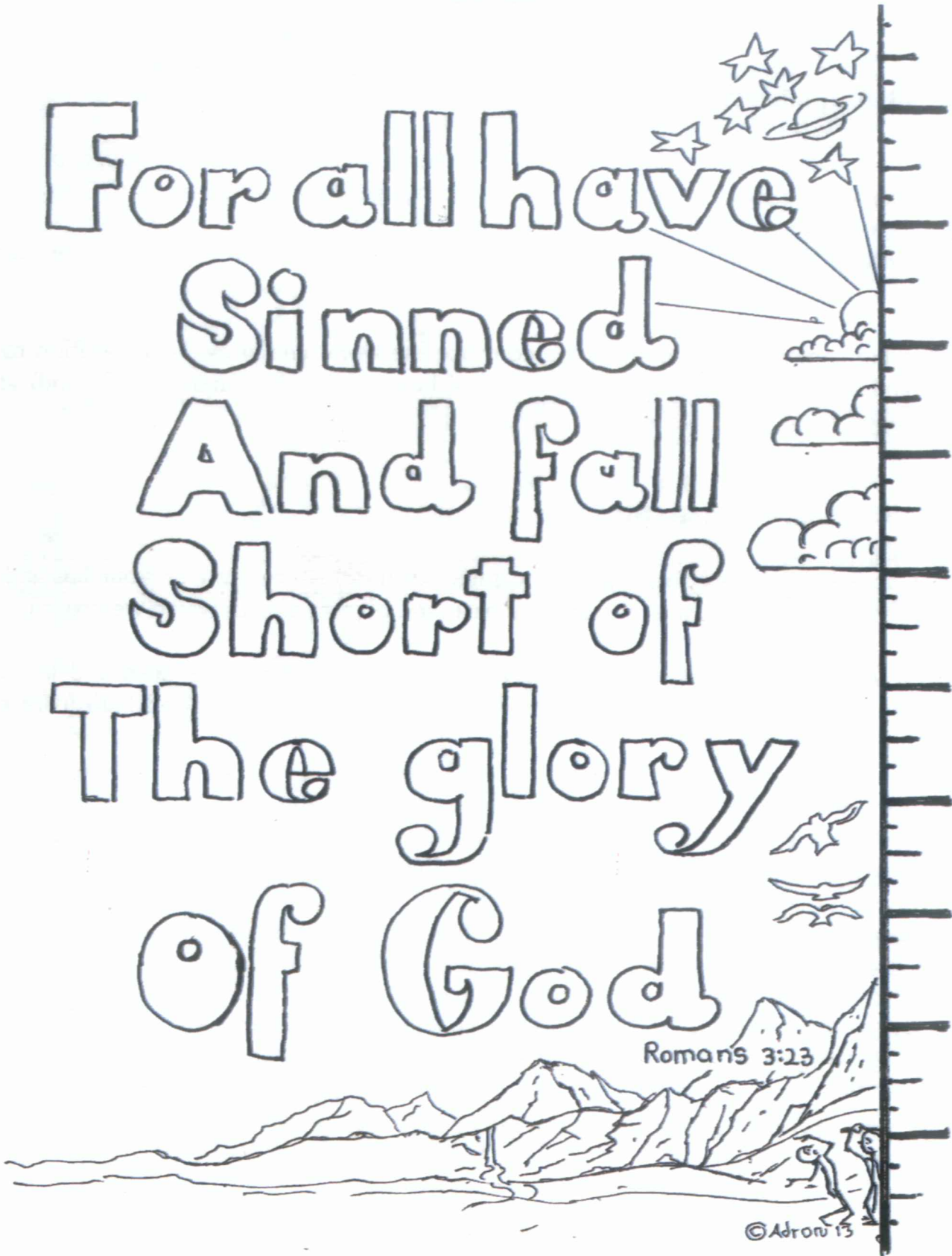

John 16:7-8 Amplified Bible (AMP)

⁷ However, I am telling you nothing but the truth when I say it is profitable (good, expedient, advantageous) for you that I go away. Because if I do not go away, the Comforter (Counselor, Helper, Advocate, Intercessor, Strengtheners, Standby) will not come to you [into close fellowship with you]; but if I go away, I will send Him to you [to be in close fellowship with you].

⁸ And when He comes, He will convict *and* convince the world *and* bring demonstration to it about sin and about righteousness (uprightness of heart and right standing with God) and about judgment:

Romans 10 Amplified Bible (AMP)

⁸ But what does it say? The Word (God's message in Christ) is near you, on your lips and in your heart; that is, the Word (the message, the basis and object) of faith which we preach,

⁹ Because if you acknowledge *and* **confess** with your **lips** that Jesus is Lord and in your **heart believe** (adhere to, trust in, and rely on the truth) that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

¹⁰ For with the heart a person believes (adheres to, trusts in, and relies on Christ) and so is justified (declared righteous, acceptable to God), and with the mouth he confesses (declares openly and speaks out freely his faith) *and* confirms [his] salvation.

¹¹ The Scripture says, No man who believes in Him [who adheres to, relies on, and trusts in Him] will [ever] be put to shame *or* be disappointed.

¹² [No one] for there is no distinction between Jew and Greek. The same Lord is Lord over all [of us] and He generously bestows His riches upon all who call upon Him [in faith].

¹³ For everyone who calls upon the name of the Lord [invoking Him as Lord] will be saved.

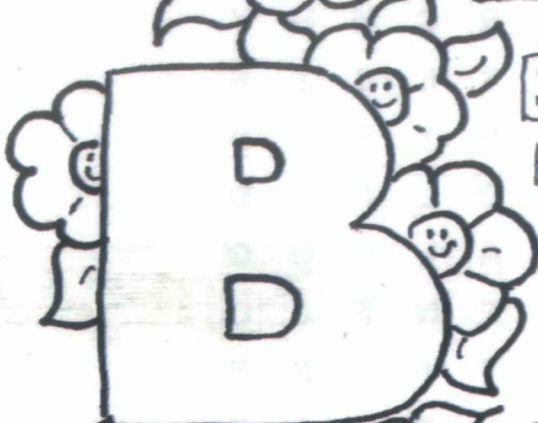

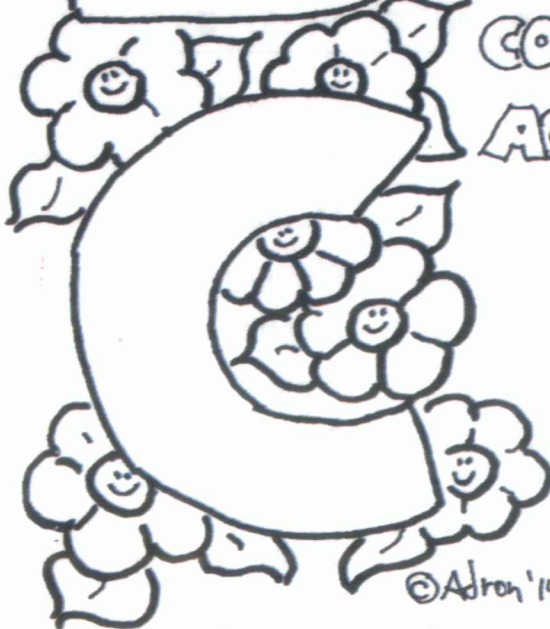

Resolve to Give Blood in January for National Blood Donor Month

The American Red Cross asks eligible blood donors to make a resolution to give blood regularly in 2015, beginning with National Blood Donor Month in January.

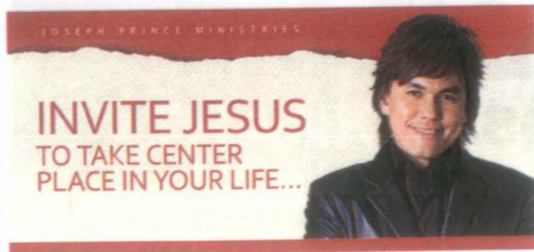
National Blood Donor Month recognizes the importance of giving blood and platelets while honoring those who roll up a sleeve to help patients in need. It has been observed during January since 1970, and that's no coincidence. Winter is an especially difficult time to collect enough blood to meet patient needs. Unpredictable winter weather can result in blood drive cancelations, and seasonal illnesses, like the flu, may cause some donors to be unable to make or keep blood donation appointments.

Donors of all blood types are needed, especially those with O negative, A negative and B negative. With a shelf life of 42 days, red blood cells must be constantly replenished to maintain an adequate supply for patients.

Individuals who come out to give blood Jan. 1 through Jan. 4 will receive a long-sleeve Red Cross T-shirt, while supplies last.

Have you ever walked around with a pebble in your shoe? Even though it’s just a tiny little stone, it affects your ability to keep walking, doesn’t it? Just imagine shopping or sightseeing with a pebble in your shoe. You’re not going to have much fun!

Having sin on your conscience is like having a pebble in your shoe. You can’t really go far in your walk with God. Like the pebble in your shoe, it’ll cause you to stumble and slow you down. Sin constantly pricking your conscience is like the sound of dripping water in the still of the night—it prevents you from getting any rest!

My friend, the only way to find rest for your conscience is to point it to the cross of Jesus. There, every sin that you have and will ever commit was punished in the body of your substitute, Jesus. Because of His sacrifice, *all* your sins have been forgiven and washed away by His cleansing blood.

Today, you can approach God with boldness and faith because your conscience has been cleansed by Jesus’ blood. The more you believe this truth, the more you’ll walk with a conscience free of the pebbles of sin, and the further you’ll go in your walk with God!

“Jesus—The One Who Always Believes”

“Jesus said to him, “If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes.”

-Mark 9:23

Mark 9:23 has been traditionally taught to mean that you can have your miracle if YOU can believe. If you can’t believe, then Jesus isn’t going to give you your miracle.

But if you study the Greek structure of the verse, it’s actually saying, “Can you believe that all things are possible to him [Jesus] who is always believing?”

That makes a world of difference! It’s not about how well or how much you can believe, but WHO you believe. **Jesus is the only one whose faith is always constant and never wavers.** His faith never fails! And if you can believe that all things are possible for Jesus who never doubts, never wavers, then you are on your way to receiving your miracle!

Beloved, have faith not in your faith, but in Him who always believes and always wants to do good to you!

Children's Sunday School

Ages 6-11

For the month of January, I believe it is fitting for the kids' Sunday school class to go back to the basics of getting "saved" or "born again". In the past, I have been diligent to question them to be sure they have done just as the Word says in Romans 10:9, "...If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." Yes, we did do an in depth study on this subject when we did our "Dare to be a Daniel" series, but since we have some new students, we will go back to the Word to answer some questions and misconceptions.

Most of us were brought up hearing the words, "You need to ask Jesus into your heart to be saved." Did you realize that the Word does not actually say this? Jesus did not say this when Nicodemus questions Jesus about being born again. Read John 3 again, and you will see that Jesus explains you must BELIEVE in Him to be saved, not ask Him into your heart. The Holy Spirit or Comforter is actually the One who abides in us. The Spirit did not come until Jesus ascended into heaven. (John 16:7-8).

For this reason, it is important to look again at Romans 10:9-10. The first step of salvation is to **CONFESS** with your mouth. We must confess that Jesus is Lord. Secondly, we have to **BELIEVE** in our heart that God raised Him from the dead. We have probably always used the word "heart," because Romans 10:10 tells us it is with the heart that we believe unto righteousness, however, it is with the **MOUTH** that confession is made unto salvation.

When we speak of salvation we often say, "Jesus died on the cross for our sins for our salvation." Well, He did, but He did something else that none of the other gods could do. Yes, all other false gods are dead, have died or will die, but what did Jesus do that was unique? He was the only One who was raised from the dead!!! So, it's confessing that He is the One and only Lord of Lords, and believing that He was raised from the dead! Hallelujah. That's where our supernatural happens. When these two things are done, as Romans 10:9 says, "...you will be saved."

Next month, we will dive deeper into some other misconceptions and truths regarding salvation. We will talk about believing, faith, a relationship with Jesus, and prayer with regards to salvation. We will also do a skit and freshen up on our soul winning skills. Have a wonderful New Year and make time for Him this year. Get in the Word and bring your kids to Sunday school!!!

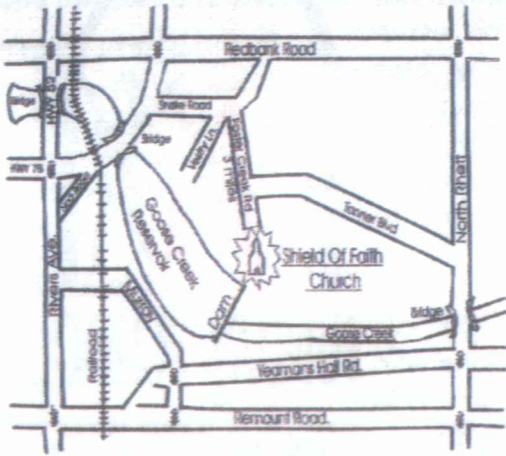
