

I thank God for the office of 'servanthood.' It is a special calling that should embrace each of us as Christians. To lay down our life for the sake of others is a not only a command but a way of life.

IJohn 3:16-18

"16 We know love by this, that He laid down His life for us; and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. 17 But whoever has the world's goods, and sees his brother <u>in need</u> and closes his heart against him, how does the love of God abide in him? 18 Little children, let us not love with <u>word or with tongue</u>, but in deed and truth."

<u>Sees his brother in need</u> in the Greek means—lack, need, to furnish what is need, touch slightly, employ.

Cooking Directions:


- 1. Brown ground beef with onion and/or green pepper and drain fat.

God knows every single thing about you, and He still loves you.



A few years ago a group of salesmen went to a regional sales convention in Chicago. They had assured their wives that they would be home in plenty of time for Friday night's dinner. In their rush, with tickets and briefcases, one of these salesmen inadvertently kicked over a table which held a display of apples. Apples flew everywhere. Without stopping or looking back, they all managed to reach the plane in time for their nearly-missed boarding.

ALL BUT ONE!!! He paused, took a deep breath, got in touch with his feelings and experienced a twinge of compassion for the girl whose apple stand had been overturned. He told his buddies to go on without him, waved good-bye, told one of them to call his wife when they arrived at their home destination and explain his taking a later flight. Then he returned to the terminal where the apples were all over the terminal floor. He was glad he did.

The 16-year-old girl was totally blind! She was softly crying, tears running down her cheeks in frustration, and at the same time helplessly groping for her spilled produce as the crowd swirled about her; no one stopping and no one to care for her plight.

The salesman knelt on the floor with her, gathered up the apples, put them back on the table and helped organize her display. As he did this, he noticed that many of them had become battered and bruised; these he set aside in another basket. When he had finished, he pulled out his wallet and said to the girl, "Here, please take this \$40 for the damage we did. Are you okay?"

She nodded through her tears. He continued on with, "I hope we didn't spoil your day too badly."

As the salesman started to walk away, the bewildered blind girl called out to him, "Mister...." He paused and turned to look back into those blind eyes. She continued, "Are you Jesus?"

He stopped in mid-stride... and he wondered. He gently went back and said, "No, I am nothing like Jesus - He is good, kind, caring, loving, and would never have bumped into your display in the first place."

The girl gently nodded: "I only asked because I prayed for Jesus to help me gather the apples. He sent you to help me, so you are like Him - only He knows who will do His will. Thank you for hearing His call, Mister."

Slowly he made his way to catch the later flight with that question burning and bouncing about in his soul: "Are you Jesus?"

Do people mistake you for Jesus? That's our destiny, is it not?

To be so much like Jesus that people cannot tell the difference as we live and interact with a world that is blind to His love, life and grace.

A Wife for Isaac


Genesis 24:1-26

- Abraham was now very old, and the LORD had blessed him in every way.² Abraham said to his oldest servant, who was in charge of everything he owned, "Put your hand under my leg.^{[a]3} Make a promise to me before the LORD, the God of heaven and earth. Don't get a wife for my son from the Canaanite girls who live around here.⁴ Instead, go back to my country, to the land of my relatives, and get a wife for my son Isaac."
- ⁵ The servant said to him, "What if this woman does not want to return with me to this land? Then, should I take your son with me back to your homeland?"
- ⁶ Abraham said to him, "No! Don't take my son back there.⁷ The LORD, the God of heaven, brought me from the home of my father and the land of my relatives. And he promised me, 'I will give this land to your descendants.' The LORD will send his angel before you to help you get a wife for my son there.⁸ If the girl won't come back with you, you will be free from this promise. But you must not take my son back there."⁹ So the servant put his hand under his master's leg and made a promise to Abraham about this.
- ¹⁰ The servant took ten of Abraham's camels and left, carrying with him many different kinds of beautiful gifts. He went to Northwest Mesopotamia to Nahor's city. In the evening, when the women come out to get water, he made the camels kneel down at the well outside the city.
- ¹² The servant said, "LORD, God of my master Abraham, allow me to find a wife for his son today. Please show this kindness to my master Abraham.¹³ Here I am, standing by the spring, and the girls from the city are coming out to get water.¹⁴ I will say to one of them, 'Please put your jar down so I can drink.' Then let her say, 'Drink, and I will also give water to your camels.' If that happens, I will know she is the right one for your servant Isaac and that you have shown kindness to my master."
- ¹⁵ Before the servant had finished praying, Rebekah, the daughter of Bethuel, came out of the city. (Bethuel was the son of Milcah and Nahor, Abraham's brother.) Rebekah was carrying her water jar on her shoulder. ¹⁶ She was very pretty, a virgin; she had never had sexual relations with a man. She went down to the spring and filled her jar, then came back up. ¹⁷ The servant ran to her and said, "Please give me a little water from your jar."
- ¹⁸ Rebekah said, "Drink, sir." She quickly lowered the jar from her shoulder and gave him a drink. ¹⁹ After he finished drinking, Rebekah said, "I will also pour some water for your camels." ²⁰ So she quickly poured all the water from her jar into the drinking trough for the camels. Then she kept running to the well until she had given all the camels enough to drink.
- ²¹ The servant quietly watched her. He wanted to be sure the LORD had made his trip successful.²² After the camels had finished drinking, he gave Rebekah a gold ring weighing one-fifth of an ounce and two gold arm bracelets weighing about four ounces each.²³ He asked, "Who is your father? Is there a place in his house for me and my men to spend the night?"
- ²⁴ Rebekah answered, "My father is Bethuel, the son of Milcah and Nahor." Then she said, "And, yes, we have straw for your camels and a place for you to spend the night."
- ²⁶ The servant bowed and worshiped the LORD²⁷ and said, "Blessed is the LORD, the God of my master Abraham. The LORD has been kind and truthful to him and has led me to my master's relatives."

November is American Diabetes Month, a time to rally individuals, communities and families to join the millions of people in the Stop Diabetes movement. Diabetes mellitus (MELL-ih-tus) is a condition characterized by hyperglycemia resulting from the body's inability to use blood glucose for energy. In Type I diabetes, the pancreas no longer makes insulin and therefore blood glucose cannot enter the cells to be used for energy. In Type 2 diabetes, either the pancreas does not make enough insulin or the body is unable to use insulin correctly.

Diabetes Statistics

- Nearly 26 million children and adults in the United States have diabetes.
- Diabetes is the leading cause of kidney failure.
- · Diabetes is the leading cause of new cases of blindness among adults.
- The American Diabetes Association estimates that the total national cost of diagnosed diabetes in the United States is \$174 billion.
- An estimated 79 million adults have pre-diabetes, a condition that places them at increased risk for developing type 2 diabetes and heart disease.

Who is at Greater Risk for Type 2 Diabetes?

- People with impaired glucose tolerance (IGT) and/or impaired fasting glucose (IFG)
- People over age 45
- · People with a family history of diabetes
- People who are overweight
- People who do not exercise regularly
- People with low HDL cholesterol or high triglycerides, high blood pressure
- Certain racial and ethnic groups (e.g., Non-Hispanic Blacks, Hispanic/Latino Americans, Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders, and American Indians and Alaska Natives)
- Women who had gestational diabetes, or who have had a baby weighing 9 pounds or more at birth.

How to Reduce Your Risk

Diabetes complications can be prevented or delayed by properly managing blood glucose, blood pressure and cholesterol levels. In addition, eating healthy, being physically active and quitting smoking can help lower the risk of diabetes complications.

The more you seek Him, the more you will be able to learn and discern His voice. Spend time in the Word and talk to Him throughout the day. Yes, we all make mistakes, too, but you have to not get down on yourself. Go to I John I:9, confess your sins to Him and the one you wronged, and make a change in your life. Keep going instead of sulking in your sin. God is not a God of condemnation and regret. He wants you to move on and learn from your mistake and help others with your testimony. So, put your head up, know that your confidence is in Him and enjoy your day and your life! God is a good God."

Rachel has a few childhood friends, whom she really loves, and she knows some of them are not "sold out" and are still very much a part of the "world". It hurts her to see how deceived they are, and she unashamedly gives them little tidbits of encouragement and God's Word. Those seeds are one day going to come forth! She is so eager for all of God's children to really see their worth, and to put their chin up and realize that they are the "righteousness of God" and really live it out! We can live in victory every day!

We are so proud of you Rachel! You are such a great example and an encouragement to us all... AND a beautiful woman too!!! May God continue to bless you and your family as you serve our Lord.

Adults in Childhood

Mark 10:15 reads, "...whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will by no means enter it." I've usually seen this as pointing to the positives of innocence, trust, and simplicity. Adults will have difficulty approaching the Lord with suspicion, pride, self-sufficiency, dull conscience, or a know-it-all attitude. There are certain advantages to accepting Christ at a young age, such as more years available to serve the Lord.

The Old Testament makes frequent references to the "children of Israel" or the "children of men." Notably, the same phrase occurs in Ps. 107:8, 15, 21, and 31, "Oh, that men would give thanks to the Lord for His goodness, and for His wonderful works to the children of men!" But in Judges, another phrase is repeated, "...the children of Israel did evil in the sight of the Lord."

God, the Ancient of Days, saw His people as children, whether on the good or the bad side.

Plusses and minuses appear in the New Testament as well. As I Cor. 14:20 states, "...in malice be babes, but in understanding be mature." Yet with the coming of Christ, God expects an corporate maturation of His people. Gal. 3:24-25 states that children study under tutors (the Law), but that Christian faith has superseded this. The maturing saint in I Cor. 13:11 no longer speaks, understands, nor thinks as a child. We are encouraged to eat solid food, exercise our spiritual senses (Heb. 5:14), and be able to receive spiritual wisdom (I Cor. 2:6).

However, not everyone lives up to the ideal. Paul had to preach milk to the Corinthian church due to their continuing immaturity. He reproved the Galatians for backsliding into bondage. Children were described as "tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of men..." (Eph. 4:14) Others were spiritually held back in school, when they should have been teachers (Heb. 5:12-13). The Lord who said, "I do not want you to be ignorant," (I Cor. 12:1) can only do so much with those who don't grow, even though they are still loved. As it says in I Cor. 14:38, "But if anyone is ignorant, let him be ignorant."

When a whole nation refuses to grow in accordance with God's will, don't be surprised if God's judgment begins to manifest. One such judgment appears in Isa. 3:4, "I will give children to be their princes, and babes shall rule over them." In a nation that permits the ballot box, immature voters may well elect immature candidates. An immature media will be unable to discern what is continuing to happen. People will follow immature Hollywood stars. But we should be well aware of the works of the flesh listed in Gal. 5:19-21. I could add a few others to that list, characteristics of immaturity using modern language: Lack of respect, not exercising or accepting responsibility, having a sense of entitlement, ingratitude, having only a short term perspective, remaining ignorant, and blaming others when things don't turn out as expected.

We are not surprised when these characteristics appear in grade school children, but I would like to think that as adult Christians we can put these things behind us. Here is an opportunity for us to examine ourselves and repent where needed. If nothing else, we can be examples to an unrepentant society.


