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Fitting The Living Stones Together—Part

Let us be honest. Our real problem in many churches is that those who see themselves as the "most spiritual" cannot work together. It is easy for such people to find spiritual-sounding "reasons" for their private and independent lifestyle. Yet the true reason they refuse to be built together with others is that they love the subtle preeminence which comes from their individualism.

Many Christians are delightful individuals, whose lives are well ordered. They are conscientious about having an early morning quiet time and are earnest in witness and ministry. They are exemplary individuals who evoke the commendation of others. Yet, they remain individualists who cannot be "built" together with others.

Such people are precious stones who love to develop their own spiritual stature; so precious, in fact, that they cannot be fitted together with common clay or stone. It would seem that they are just too beautiful to be joined with others in one building, so they remain individualists—lovely for display but no good for building. They are more involved in their "own" spirituality than in building up others.

Full Stature Requires Relatedness

All of this is to emphasize: The full stature which God intends for each living stone cannot be reached apart from a proper relatedness to the corporate stature of the body of Christ. How this wounds our individualistic yearnings! God is not primarily after a lot of separate stones, however polished and beautiful they may be. He wants a complete spiritual house.

This has been aptly illustrated by Watchman Nee:

One sister, speaking to me of another, said: "Oh, she's such a precious sister—so spiritual!"

When I asked more about her, she said: "Oh, she's so humble, so quiet, so gentle; I have never known her to be irritated." And again she added, "She's so spiritual!"

"Who is she spiritual with?" I asked. "Is she an isolated spiritual sister, or has her spirituality related her to others?"

"Well," replied the sister, "singers who strike such high notes as she find few who can sing with them."

Alas, that sister was so spiritual that no one could be her spiritual companion. Such a sister is all right for display purposes, but she is of no use for building the church. The kind of sister needed in the church is one who can have other living stones placed behind her and in front of her; and to her left and her right; and above and below her. That is the sort of Christian God is seeking today.

- I) In all our ways we are to KNOW Him—pray and have a deeper relationship with Him daily.
- ACKNOWLEDGE Him—don't ignore Him when He leads you to do something. Pay attention to Him and don't ignore His promptings.
- 3) **RECOGNIZE** Him—His sheep know His voice. Do you recognize it?

We are to differentiate between the voices we hear and know their source. **2 Corinthians 10:5**— "Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ."

"Lemon cheesecake with baked plums & blackberries"

Ingredients:

200g shortbread biscuits 25g butter, melted 600g full-fat cream cheese 75g golden caster sugar 4 large eggs zest I large lemon 3 tsp vanilla extract 100ml soured cream

For the baked fruit

8 plums, halved, stone removed, then cut into wedges 300g blackberries 100g light muscovado sugar



Directions

Heat oven to 300 degrees. Line the base of a 22cm round, spring form tin with baking parchment. Put the biscuits in a food processor and whizz to fine crumbs. Tip into a bowl, add the melted butter and mix well. Press the biscuits into the base of the cake tin and put in the fridge to chill.

Beat together the cream cheese and sugar with an electric hand whisk until smooth. Carefully add the eggs, one at a time with the lemon zest and vanilla extract until well mixed, but don't over whisk. Pour the mixture onto the chilled biscuit base and bake in the middle of the oven for 50 minutes until just set. Set aside to cool for 10 minutes, then remove from the tin and allow to cool completely.

Meanwhile, turn the oven up to 400 degrees. Put the plums, blackberries and sugar in a large roasting tin and toss together well. Bake in the oven for 10-12 minutes until the fruits have collapsed and the sauce is syrupy. Remove from the oven and leave to cool.

When the cheesecake is completely cooled, spoon the soured cream over the top and spread in a thin layer. Serve in wedges topped with some of the baked plums and blackberries, and the rest on the side.



Kids' Corner John 9Amplified Bible (AMP)

Healing the Man Born Blind

9 While He was passing by, He noticed a man [who had been] blind from birth. ² His disciples asked Him, "Rabbi (Teacher), who sinned, this man or his parents, that he would be born blind?" ³ Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents sinned, but it was so that the works of God might be displayed and illustrated in him. ⁴ We must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; night is coming when no one can work. ⁵ As long as I am in the world, I am the Light of the world [giving guidance through My word and works]." ⁶ When He had said this, He spat on the ground and made mud with His saliva, and He spread the mud [like an ointment] on the man's eyes. ⁷ And He said to him, "Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (which is translated, Sent). So he went away and washed, and came back seeing. ⁸ So the neighbors, and those who used to know him as a beggar, said, "Is not this the man who used to sit and beg?" ⁹ Some said, "It is he." Still others said, "No, but he looks like him." But he kept saying, "I am the man." ¹⁰ So they said to him, "How were your eyes opened?" ¹¹ He replied, "The Man called Jesus made mud and smeared it on my eyes and told me, 'Go to Siloam and wash.' So I went and washed, and I received my sight!" ¹² They asked him, "Where is He?" He said, "I do not know."

Controversy over the Man

¹³ Then they brought the man who was formerly blind to the Pharisees. ¹⁴ Now it was on a Sabbath day that Jesus made the mud and opened the man's eyes. ¹⁵ So the Pharisees asked him again how he received his sight. And he said to them, "He smeared mud on my eyes, and I washed, and now I see." ¹⁶ Then some of the Pharisees said, "This Man [Jesus] is not from God, because He does not keep the Sabbath." But others said, "How can a man who is a sinner (a non-observant Jew) do such signs and miracles?" So there was a difference of opinion among them. ¹⁷ Accordingly they said to the blind man again, "What do you say about Him, since He opened your eyes?" And he said, "[It must be that] He is a prophet!"

¹⁸ However, the Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight until they called the man's parents. ¹⁹ They asked them, "Is this your son, who you say was born blind? Then how does he now see?" ²⁰ His parents answered, "We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind; ²¹ but as to how he now sees, we do not know; or who has opened his eyes, we do not know. Ask him [and stop asking us]; he is of age, he will speak for himself *and* give his own account of it." ²² His parents said this because they were afraid of [the leaders of] the Jews; for the Jews had already agreed that if anyone acknowledged Jesus to be the Christ, he would be put out of the synagogue (excommunicated). ²³ Because of this his parents said, "He is of age; ask him."

²⁴So a second time they called the man who had been [born] blind, and said to him, "Give God glory and praise [for your sight]! We know this Man [Jesus] is a sinner [separated from God]." ²⁵Then he answered, "I do not know whether He is a sinner [separated from God]; but one thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see." ²⁶So they said to him, "What did He [actually] do to you? How did He open your eyes?" ²⁷He answered, "I already told you and you did not listen. Why do you want to hear it again and again? Do you want to become His disciples, too?" ²⁸And [at that remark] they stormed at him and jeered, "You are His disciple, but we are disciples of Moses! ²⁹We know [for certain] that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this Man, we do not know where He is from." ³⁰The man replied, "Well, this is astonishing! You do not know where He comes from, and yet He opened my eyes! ³¹We know [according to your tradition] that God does not hear sinners; but if anyone fears God and does His will, He hears him. ³²Since the beginning of time it has never been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a person born blind. ³³If this Man were not from God, He would not be able to do anything [like this because God would not hear His prayer]." ³⁴They answered him, "You were born entirely in sins [from head to foot], and you [presume to] teach us?" Then they threw him out [of the synagogue].

Toast over medium heat until the aroma of the almonds begins to rise (about 5 minutes). Top the yogurt mixture with the almonds, peaches, and blueberries. Stir thoroughly. Enjoy.

Ages 6-11


For the month of September, the children's Sunday School class will be studying John chapter 9. The story begins when Jesus was passing by a man who was blind from birth. His disciples thought this man or his family must have sinned in their past, and the blindness was a result of this sin. Jesus' response was, "Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but that the works of God should be made manifest in him," John 9:3. How cool is that! God was going to use something bad (the man's blindness) to show His greatness through his healing.

Interestingly, when Jesus healed this blind man, He did not do a fancy prayer. He simply spat on the ground, making a clay, anointed the man's eyes with the clay, and told the man to wash in the pool of Siloam. A simple act of the blind man's obedience and believing was part of the completion of his healing. I wonder what would have happened if he chose not to obey Jesus. The man said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshipped Him. As we have learned in this class before, the kids and all believers have the ability to heal in the name of Jesus. Mark 16:17 and 18 says, "And these signs shall follow them that believe; In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues; They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover." Hallelujah!

Later in the chapter, we see how the Jews and Pharisees still refused to believe that Jesus was the Son of God, even after the man admitted that Jesus "opened" his eyes. They proclaimed, "This man is not of God, because he keepeth not the Sabbath day." These men were so bound by the law, they could not see that Jesus was the Son of God. They could "physically" see, but they were "spiritually" blind! We will be learning that we are not bound to the Sabbath day law today, but that we must instead do the work of Him who sent us. If we couldn't do anything on the Sabbath, then we shouldn't pray, go to church or minister to others on Sunday!

Praise God that we are now free from the bondages of the law, and we are alive to reign with Christ Jesus!


